For children aged 23 through 3 years and for children aged 4 through 8 years who 24 weigh 40 pounds or less, such restraint device must be a 25 separate carrier or a vehicle manufacturer's integrated child seat. For children aged 4 through 8 5 years who weigh more 26 27 than 40 pounds but less than 80 pounds and who are less than 4 feet 9 inches in height, a separate carrier, an integrated 28 29 child seat, or a child booster seat must seat belt may be used. Effective July 1, 2001, a driver of a motor vehicle who 30 violates this paragraph may be issued a verbal warning and 31
