Subsection (1) of section 760.11, Florida 11 12 Statutes, is amended to read: 760.11 Administrative and civil remedies; 13 14 construction. --15 (1) Any person aggrieved by a violation of ss. 760.01-760.10 may file a complaint with the commission within 16 17 365 days of the alleged violation, naming the employer, employment agency, labor organization, or joint 18 19 labor-management committee, or, in the case of an alleged 20 violation of s. 760.10(5), the person responsible for the 21 violation and describing the violation. Any person aggrieved 22 by a violation of s. 509.092 may file a complaint with the commission within 365 days of the alleged violation naming the 23 person responsible for the violation and describing the 24 25 violation. The commission, a commissioner, or the Attorney General may in like manner file such a complaint. On the same 26 27 day the complaint is filed with the commission, the commission 28 shall clearly stamp on the face of the complaint the date the 29 complaint was filed with the commission. In addition, the 30 complaint may be filed with the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission or with any unit of government of the state which 31 1

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is a fair-employment-practice agency under section 706 of the 1 Civil Rights Act of 1964 (Pub. L. No. 88-352), as amended, 42 2 3 U.S.C. s. 2000e-5. The Equal Employment Opportunity Commission or the local section 706 agency shall clearly stamp on the 4 5 face of the complaint the date the complaint was filed with 6 the commission. The date of filing with the commission is the earliest date of filing with the Equal Employment Opportunity 7 Commission, the local section 706 agency, or the commission. 8 9 The complaint shall contain a short and plain statement of the 10 facts describing the violation and the relief sought. The commission may require additional information to be in the 11 complaint. The commission, within 5 days of the complaint 12 being filed, shall by registered mail send a copy of the 13 14 complaint to the person who allegedly committed the violation. The person who allegedly committed the violation may file an 15 answer to the complaint within 25 days of the date the 16 17 complaint was filed with the commission. Any answer filed shall be mailed to the aggrieved person by the person filing 18 19 the answer. Both the complaint and the answer shall be verified. 20 Section 2.
