The Department of Environmental Protection, 14 in consultation with representatives of the petroleum 15 industry, shall study the effects and consequences of the use 16 17 of the gasoline additive MTBE in this state, the areas of concern resulting from the use of MTBE, any alternative 18 19 additives that may be used in place of MTBE, and the effects 20 and consequences of using those alternative additives. The 21 study must take into account the results of the study on MTBE 22 conducted by the Blue Ribbon Panel of the United States Environmental Protection Agency, determine the applicability 23 of the results of that study, and determine actions that 24 25 should be undertaken in this state. By January 15, 2002, the 26 department shall submit to the Legislature a report containing 27 the results of its study and the department's recommendations 28 for legislation, if any. The Legislature requests that representatives of the petroleum industry participate with the 29

department in the study to the extent practicable.
