(b) Adequate provision shall be made by law for a 23 24 uniform, efficient, safe, secure, and high quality system of 25 free public schools that allows students to obtain a high 26 quality education. grade 3 does not exceed 16 students;

- 2. The maximum number of students who are assigned to each certified classroom teacher who is teaching in his or her field in public school classrooms for grades 4 through 8 does not exceed 20 students; and
- 3. The maximum number of students who are assigned to each certified classroom teacher who is teaching in his or her field in public school classrooms for grades 9 through 12 does not exceed 25 students.

The limitations in this subsection do not apply to extracurricular classes. Payment of the costs associated with reducing classroom size to achieve these limitations is the responsibility of the state and not of the local school districts. Beginning with the 2003-2004 fiscal year, the legislature shall provide each year sufficient funds to reduce the average number of students in each classroom by at least one student per year until the maximum number of students per classroom does not exceed the limitations prescribed in this subsection.

(c) Adequate provision shall be made by law and for the establishment, maintenance, and operation of institutions of higher learning and other public education programs that the needs of the people may require.

ARTICLE IX, SECTION 1

CLASSROOM SIZE LIMITATIONS; STATE RESPONSIBILITY FOR COSTS.--Proposing an amendment to the State Constitution to

require the Legislature to ensure that there are enough classrooms to keep the maximum number of students in public school classrooms for grades prekindergarten through 12th grade from exceeding specified maximum numbers, and to require the state, not the school districts, to pay the associated costs.
