1 (a) Is unable without another's assistance to attend 2 the polls. 3 (b) Is an inspector, a poll worker, a deputy voting machine custodian, a deputy sheriff, a supervisor of 4 5 elections, or a deputy supervisor who is assigned to a 6 different precinct than that in which he or she is registered 7 to vote. 8 (c) On account of the tenets of his or her religion, 9 cannot attend the polls on the day of the general, special, or 10 primary election. 11 (d) May not be in the precinct of his or her residence during the hours the polls are open for voting on the day of 12 13 the election. 14 (e) Has changed his or her residency to another county 15 in this state within the time period during which the 16 registration books are closed for the election for which the 17 ballot is requested. (f) Has changed his or her residency to another state 18 19 and is ineligible under the laws of that state to vote in the 20 general election; however, this pertains only to presidential 21 ballots. Section 2. Paragraph (b) of subsection (1) of section 22 101.62, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 23 24 101.62 Request for absentee ballots.--25 (1)26 The supervisor may accept a written or telephonic (b) 27 request for an absentee ballot from the elector, or, if directly instructed by the elector, a member of the elector's 28 29 immediate family, or the elector's legal guardian. For 30 purposes of this section, the term "immediate family" has the 31

same meaning as specified in paragraph (4)(b). The person 1 2 making the request must disclose: 3 The name of the elector for whom the ballot is 1. 4 requested; 5 The elector's address; 2 б 3. The last four digits of the elector's social 7 security number; 8 4. The registration number on the elector's date of 9 birth registration identification card; 10 5. The requester's name; 11 6. The requester's address; The requester's social security number and, if 12 7. 13 available, driver's license number; The requester's relationship to the elector; and 14 8. 15 The requester's signature (written requests only). 9. Section 3. Section 101.657, Florida Statutes, is 16 17 amended to read: 18 101.657 Voting absentee ballots in person.--19 (1) Notwithstanding s. 97.021(1), Any qualified and 20 registered elector who is unable to attend the polls on 21 election day may pick up and vote an absentee ballot in person at the office of, and under the supervision of, the supervisor 22 of elections. Before receiving the ballot, the elector must 23 24 present a Florida driver's license, a Florida identification card issued under s. 322.051, or another form of picture 25 identification approved by the Department of State. If the 26 elector fails to furnish the required identification, or if 27 28 the supervisor is in doubt as to the identity of the elector, 29 the supervisor must follow the procedure prescribed in s. 101.49. 30 31

I have changed my permanent residency to another 26 27 county in Florida within the time period during which the 28 registration books are closed for the election. I understand 29 that I am allowed to vote only for national and statewide 30 offices and on statewide issues. 31

1 101.65 Instructions to absent electors.--The 2 supervisor shall enclose with each absentee ballot separate 3 printed instructions in substantially the following form: 4 5 READ THESE INSTRUCTIONS CAREFULLY BEFORE MARKING BALLOT. 6 1. VERY IMPORTANT. In order to ensure that your 7 absentee ballot will be counted, it should be completed and returned as soon as possible so that it can reach the 8 9 supervisor of elections of the county in which your precinct 10 is located no later than 7 p.m. on the day of the election. 11 2. Mark your ballot in secret as instructed on the ballot. You must mark your own ballot unless you are unable to 12 13 do so because of blindness, disability, or inability to read 14 or write. 15 3. Place your marked ballot in the enclosed secrecy 16 envelope. 17 4. Insert the secrecy envelope into the enclosed mailing envelope which is addressed to the supervisor. 18 19 5. Seal the mailing envelope and completely fill out 20 the Voter's Certificate on the back of the mailing envelope. 6. VERY IMPORTANT. In order for your absentee ballot 21 22 to be counted, you must sign your name on the line above (Voter's Signature)., place the last four digits of your 23 24 Social Security number in the space provided, and your ballot 25 must be witnessed in either of the following manners: a. One witness, who is a registered voter in the 26 27 state, must affix his or her signature, printed name, address, 28 voter identification number, and county of registration on the 29 voter's certificate. Each witness is limited to witnessing five ballots per election unless certified as an absentee 30 31

1 ballot coordinator. A candidate may not serve as an attesting 2 witness. 3 b. Any notary or other officer entitled to administer 4 oaths or any Florida supervisor of elections or deputy 5 supervisor of elections, other than a candidate, may serve as б an attesting witness. 7 7. VERY IMPORTANT. In order for your absentee ballot 8 to be counted, it must include the signature and address of a 9 witness 18 years of age or older affixed to the voter's 10 certificate. No candidate may serve as an attesting witness. 11 8.7. Mail, deliver, or have delivered the completed 12 mailing envelope. Be sure there is sufficient postage if 13 mailed. 9.8. FELONY NOTICE. It is a felony under Florida law 14 15 to accept any gift, payment, or gratuity in exchange for your vote for a candidate. It is also a felony under Florida law to 16 17 vote in an election using a false identity or false address, or under any other circumstances making your ballot false or 18 19 fraudulent. 20 Section 6. Paragraph (c) of subsection (2) of section 21 101.68, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 101.68 Canvassing of absentee ballot .--22 23 (2)24 (c)1. The canvassing board shall, if the supervisor 25 has not already done so, compare the signature of the elector on the voter's certificate with the signature of the elector 26 in the registration books to see that the elector is duly 27 28 registered in the county and to determine the legality of that 29 absentee ballot. An absentee ballot shall be considered illegal if it does not include the signature and the last four 30 31 digits of the social security number of the elector, as shown 10

1 by the registration records, and the signature and address of 2 an attesting witness.either: 3 a. The subscription of a notary or officer defined in Item 6.b. of the instruction sheet, or 4 5 b. The signature, printed name, address, voter б identification number, and county of registration of one 7 attesting witness, who is a registered voter in the state. 8 9 However, an absentee ballot shall not be considered illegal if 10 the signature of the elector or attesting witness does not 11 cross the seal of the mailing envelope or if the person witnessing the ballot is in violation of s. 104.047(3). If the 12 canvassing board determines that any ballot is illegal, a 13 member of the board shall, without opening the envelope, mark 14 across the face of the envelope: "rejected as illegal." The 15 envelope and the ballot contained therein shall be preserved 16 17 in the manner that official ballots voted are preserved. If any elector or candidate present believes that 18 2. 19 an absentee ballot is illegal due to a defect apparent on the 20 voter's certificate, he or she may, at any time before the ballot is removed from the envelope, file with the canvassing 21 22 board a protest against the canvass of that ballot, specifying the precinct, the ballot, and the reason he or she believes 23 24 the ballot to be illegal. A challenge based upon a defect in 25 the voter's certificate may not be accepted after the ballot has been removed from the mailing envelope. 26 27 Section 7. Section 101.647, Florida Statutes, is 28 repealed. 29 Section 8. Section 104.047, Florida Statutes, is 30 amended to read: 31 104.047 Absentee ballots and voting; violations.--11

1	(1) Any person who provides or offers to provide, and
2	any person who accepts, a pecuniary or other benefit in
3	exchange for distributing, ordering, requesting, collecting,

7	limiting third parties to returning 2 absentee ballots per election, and the corresponding criminal penalty.
