I. Summary:

This legislation re-creates the Lottery Administrative Trust Fund without modification, effective November 4, 2004. The Lottery Administrative Trust Fund, FLAIR #36-2-021, is administered by the Department of the Lottery. This fund was last re-created by Chapter 97-133.

II. Present Situation:

The Lottery Administrative Trust Fund was created for the deposition of funds received by the department after payment of prizes and initial compensation is paid to retailers. Fifty percent of the gross revenue from the sale of lottery tickets is returned to the public in the form of prizes paid by the department. At least 38 percent of the gross revenue is deposited into the Educational Enhancement Trust Fund for the benefit of public education. Funds that remain after transfers to the Educational Enhancement Trust Fund are used for payment of the administrative expenses of the department.

III. Effect of Proposed Changes:

This bill re-creates the trust fund without modification.
