I. Summary:

This legislation terminates the Wireless Emergency Telephone System Trust fund effective November 4, 2004 and re-creates the same without modification, effective November 4, 2004. The Wireless Emergency Telephone System Trust Fund, FLAIR #72-2-344, is administered by the Department of the Management Services. This fund was created by Chapter 99-203.

II. Present Situation:

The re-creation of the Wireless Emergency Telephone System Trust Fund would provide funding to enable the state to act as a conduit between the service providers to ensure that customer data remains confidential, proprietary information.

This bill re-creates the trust fund without modification.
