## I. Summary:

This legislation re-creates the Supervision Trust Fund without modification, effective November 4, 2004. The Supervision Trust Fund, FLAIR #72-2-696, is administered by the Department of the Management Services. This fund was last re-created by Chapter 97-147.

The re-creation of the Supervision Trust Fund would provide funding for the operation of both the Division of Facilities Management and the Division of Capitol Police within the Department of Management Services.
