## I. Summary:

This legislation re-creates the Lifetime Fish and Wildlife Trust Fund without modification, effective November 4, 2004. The Lifetime Fish and Wildlife Trust Fund, FLAIR #77-2-458, is administered by the Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission. This fund was last re-created by Chapter 97-131.

## II. Present Situation:

The re-creation of the Lifetime Fish and Wildlife Trust Fund would provide for receipt of funding for fish and wildlife conservation programs throughout the state.

This bill re-creates the trust fund without modification.
