This training shall include, but not be limited to, managing problem behaviors, promoting the resident's independence in activities of daily living, and skills in working with families and caregivers.
- (a) For certified nursing assistants, the required 4 hours of training shall be part of the total hours of training required annually.
- (b) For health care practitioners licensed pursuant to chapter 456, continuing education hours completed as required by the board shall be counted toward this total of 4 hours.
- (4) For employees who are health care practitioners licensed pursuant to chapter 456, training that is sanctioned by the health care practitioner's board shall be considered to be approved by the Department of Elderly Affairs.
- (5) The Department of Elderly Affairs or its designee shall approve the initial and continuing training provided to employees under this section. The department shall approve training offered in a variety of formats, including, but not limited to, Internet-based, video, teleconferencing, and classroom instruction. The department shall keep a list of current providers who are approved to provide initial and continuing training. The department shall adopt rules to

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establish standards for the trainers and the training required in this section.

(6) Upon completing any training listed in this section, the employee or direct caregiver shall be issued a certificate that includes the name of the training provider, the topic covered, and the date and signature of the training provider. This training shall include, but not be limited to, an overview of dementias and shall provide
