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19	Section 1. Section 400.1755, Florida Statutes, is
20	created to read:
21	400.1755 Care for persons with Alzheimer's disease or
22	other related disorders; dementia-specific training
23	(1)(a) An individual who is employed by a facility
24	that provides care for residents with Alzheimer's disease or
25	other related disorders must complete up to 4 hours of initial
26	dementia-specific training developed or approved by the
27	department. The training shall be completed within 3 months
28	after beginning employment.
29	(b) A direct caregiver who is employed by a facility
30	that provides care for residents with Alzheimer's disease or
31	other related disorders, and who provides direct care to such

residents, must complete the required initial training and 4 additional hours of training developed or approved by the department. The training shall be completed within 9 months after beginning employment.

- (2) In addition to the training required under subsection (1), a direct caregiver must participate in a minimum of 4 contact hours of dementia-specific continuing education each calendar year, as approved by the department.
- (3) Upon completing any training listed in subsection (1), the employee or direct caregiver shall be issued a certificate that includes the name of the training provider, the topic covered, and the date and signature of the training provider. The certificate is evidence of completion of training in the identified topic, and the employee or direct caregiver is not required to repeat training in that topic if the employee or direct caregiver changes employment to a different facility. The employee or direct caregiver must comply with other applicable continuing education requirements.
- (4) The department, or its designee, shall approve the initial and continuing education courses and providers.
- (5) The department shall keep a current list of providers who are approved to provide initial and continuing education for staff of facilities that provide care for persons with Alzheimer's disease or other related disorders.
- (6) Any facility more than 90 percent of whose residents receive monthly optional supplementation payments is not required to pay for the training and education programs required under this section. A facility that has one or more such residents shall pay a reduced fee that is proportional to the percentage of such residents in the facility. A facility

that does not have any residents who receive monthly optional supplementation payments must pay a reasonable fee, as established by the department, for such training and education programs.

- (7) The department shall adopt rules to establish standards for trainers and training and to implement this section.
- Section 2. Subsections (1), (2), (3), and (6) of section 400.4178, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:
- 400.4178 Special Care for persons with Alzheimer's disease or other related disorders.--
- (1) Any facility that admits or provides care to a person A facility which advertises that it provides special care for persons with Alzheimer's disease or other related disorders must meet the following standards of operation:
- (a)1. If the facility has 17 or more residents, have an awake staff member on duty at all hours of the day and night; or
- 2. If the facility has fewer than 17 residents, have an awake staff member on duty at all hours of the day and night or have mechanisms in place to monitor and ensure the safety of the facility's residents.
- (b) Offer activities specifically designed for persons who are cognitively impaired.
- (c) Have a physical environment that provides for the safety and welfare of the facility's residents.
- (d) Employ staff who have completed the training and continuing education required in  $\underline{\text{subsections}}$   $\underline{\text{subsection}}$  (2)  $\underline{\text{and } (3)}$ .
- 30 (2)(a) An individual who is employed by a facility
  31 that provides special care for residents with Alzheimer's

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disease or other related disorders, and who has regular contact with such residents, must complete up to 4 hours of initial dementia-specific training developed or approved by the department. The training shall be completed within 3 months after beginning employment and shall satisfy the core training requirements of s. 400.452(2)(g).

- (b) A direct caregiver who is employed by a facility that provides special care for residents with Alzheimer's disease or other related disorders, and who provides direct care to such residents, must complete the required initial training and 4 additional hours of training developed or approved by the department. The training shall be completed within 9 months after beginning employment and shall satisfy the core training requirements of s. 400.452(2)(g).
- (c) An individual who is employed by a facility that provides special care for residents with Alzheimer's disease or other related disorders, but who only has incidental contact with such residents, must be given, at a minimum, general information on interacting with individuals with Alzheimer's disease or other related disorders, within 3 months after beginning employment.
- (3) In addition to the training required under subsection (2), a direct caregiver must participate in a minimum of 4 contact hours of dementia-specific continuing education each calendar year, as approved by the department. The continuing education must include one or more topics included in the dementia-specific training developed or approved by the department, in which the caregiver has not received previous training.
- (6) The department shall keep a current list of 31 providers who are approved to provide initial and continuing

education for staff of facilities that provide <del>special</del> care for persons with Alzheimer's disease or other related disorders.

Section 3. Section 400.4786, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

400.4786 Care for persons with Alzheimer's disease or other related disorders; dementia-specific training.--

- (1)(a) An individual who is employed by a home health agency that provides care for clients with Alzheimer's disease or other related disorders must complete up to 4 hours of initial dementia-specific training developed or approved by the department. The training shall be completed within 3 months after beginning employment.
- (b) A direct caregiver who is employed by an agency that provides care for clients with Alzheimer's disease or other related disorders, and who provides direct care to such clients, must complete the required initial training and 4 additional hours of training developed or approved by the department. The training shall be completed within 9 months after beginning employment.
- (2) In addition to the training required under subsection (1), a direct caregiver must participate in a minimum of 4 contact hours of dementia-specific continuing education each calendar year, as approved by the department.
- (3) Upon completing any training listed in subsection (1), the employee or direct caregiver shall be issued a certificate that includes the name of the training provider, the topic covered, and the date and signature of the training provider. The certificate is evidence of completion of training in the identified topic, and the employee or direct caregiver is not required to repeat training in that topic if

the employee or direct caregiver changes employment to a different home health agency. The employee or direct caregiver must comply with other applicable continuing education requirements.

Section 4. Section 400.55715, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

400.55715 Care for persons with Alzheimer's disease or other related disorders; dementia-specific training.--

- (1)(a) An individual who is employed by an adult day care center that provides care for clients with Alzheimer's disease or other related disorders must complete up to 4 hours of initial dementia-specific training developed or approved by the department. The training shall be completed within 3 months after beginning employment.
- (b) A direct caregiver who is employed by a center that provides care for clients with Alzheimer's disease or other related disorders, and who provides direct care to such clients, must complete the required initial training and 4 additional hours of training developed or approved by the department. The training shall be completed within 9 months after beginning employment.

- (2) In addition to the training required under subsection (1), a direct caregiver must participate in a minimum of 4 contact hours of dementia-specific continuing education each calendar year, as approved by the department.
- (3) Upon completing any training listed in subsection (1), the employee or direct caregiver shall be issued a certificate that includes the name of the training provider, the topic covered, and the date and signature of the training provider. The certificate is evidence of completion of training in the identified topic, and the employee or direct caregiver is not required to repeat training in that topic if the employee or direct caregiver changes employment to a different adult day care center. The employee or direct caregiver must comply with other applicable continuing education requirements.
- (4) The department, or its designee, shall approve the initial and continuing education courses and providers.
- (5) The department shall keep a current list of providers who are approved to provide initial and continuing education for staff of adult day care centers that provide care for persons with Alzheimer's disease or other related disorders.
- (6) Any adult day care center more than 90 percent of whose clients receive monthly optional supplementation payments is not required to pay for the training and education programs required under this section. A center that has one or more such clients shall pay a reduced fee that is proportional to the percentage of such clients in the center. A center that does not have any clients who receive monthly optional supplementation payments must pay a reasonable fee,

as established by the department, for such training and education programs.

(7) The department shall adopt rules to establish standards for trainers and training and to implement this section.

Section 5. Section 400.626, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

400.626 Care for persons with Alzheimer's disease or other related disorders; dementia-specific training.--

- (1)(a) An individual who is employed by an adult family-care home that provides care for residents with Alzheimer's disease or other related disorders must complete up to 4 hours of initial dementia-specific training developed or approved by the department. The training shall be completed within 3 months after beginning employment.
- (b) A direct caregiver who is employed by a home that provides care for residents with Alzheimer's disease or other related disorders, and who provides direct care to such residents, must complete the required initial training and 4 additional hours of training developed or approved by the department. The training shall be completed within 9 months after beginning employment.
- (2) In addition to the training required under subsection (1), a direct caregiver must participate in a minimum of 4 contact hours of dementia-specific continuing education each calendar year, as approved by the department.
- (3) Upon completing any training listed in subsection (1), the employee or direct caregiver shall be issued a certificate that includes the name of the training provider, the topic covered, and the date and signature of the training provider. The certificate is evidence of completion of

training in the identified topic, and the employee or direct caregiver is not required to repeat training in that topic if the employee or direct caregiver changes employment to a different adult family-care home. The employee or direct caregiver must comply with other applicable continuing education requirements.

- (4) The department, or its designee, shall approve the initial and continuing education courses and providers.
- (5) The department shall keep a current list of providers who are approved to provide initial and continuing education for staff of adult family-care homes that provide care for persons with Alzheimer's disease or other related disorders.
- (6) Any adult family-care home more than 90 percent of whose residents receive monthly optional supplementation payments is not required to pay for the training and education programs required under this section. A home that has one or more such residents shall pay a reduced fee that is proportional to the percentage of such residents in the home. A home that does not have any residents who receive monthly optional supplementation payments must pay a reasonable fee, as established by the department, for such training and education programs.
- (7) The department shall adopt rules to establish standards for trainers and training and to implement this section.

HOUSE SUMMARY Provides requirements for dementia-specific training for individuals employed by nursing home facilities, home health agencies, adult day care centers, and adult family-care homes that care for persons with Alzheimer's disease or other related disorders. Expands requirements for training for staff of assisted living facilities that care for persons with Alzheimer's disease or other related disorders to provide for dementia-specific training and require such training for all facility employees. employees.
