A bill to be entitled

An act relating to Palm Beach County; providing for the relief of Kharmilia Ferguson, a minor, and for the relief of Angela Jones and Raymond Ferguson, individually and as the natural parents and guardians of Kharmilia Ferguson; authorizing and directing the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office to compensate them for injuries they suffered as a result of the negligence of an employee of the sheriff's office; providing for reversion of funds; providing for reimbursement of all unreimbursed medical payments made by Medicaid up to the date that this act becomes a law; providing an effective date.

WHEREAS, on August 23, 1996, 16-year-old Kharmilia N. Ferguson was operating a motor vehicle on Gramercy Drive at the intersection of Gramercy Drive and 45th Street in a suburban residential community located within Palm Beach County, and

WHEREAS, an off-duty Palm Beach County sheriff's deputy, who was operating a motor vehicle owned by the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office, approached the intersection at 78 mph in a 45-mph speed zone, and the sheriff's vehicle violently struck Kharmilia Ferguson's vehicle, and

WHEREAS, as a result of the collision, Kharmilia Ferguson sustained a severe brain injury that resulted in a permanent vegetative state and permanent hospitalization requiring lifetime attendant care, and

WHEREAS, in addition to a claim being brought on behalf of Kharmilia Ferguson for her injuries, a claim was brought on behalf of her mother, Angela Jones, and her father, Raymond Ferguson, for past and future medical expenses and other expenses, as well as for the loss of their daughter's services, comfort, companionship, society, love, affection, and solace, and

WHEREAS, after protracted litigation relating to this matter, on February 3, 2000, the parties entered into a settlement agreement in the amount of \$2 million, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the settlement agreement, the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office paid \$200,000, which is the maximum payment allowable under section 768.28, Florida Statutes, and

WHEREAS, the sheriff's office does not oppose or contest a claim bill in the amount of \$1.8 million for the remaining amount owed under the settlement agreement, NOW, THEREFORE,

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. The facts stated in the preamble to this act are found and declared to be true.

Section 2. The Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office is authorized and directed to appropriate from funds of the sheriff's office not otherwise appropriated and to draw a warrant in the sum of \$1,440,000 payable to the Special Needs Trust established for Kharmilia Ferguson to compensate her for injuries and damages sustained. Upon the death of Kharmilia Ferguson, the Trust balance shall revert to the Palm Beach

 County Sheriff's Office pursuant to the terms of the Trust agreement.

Section 3. The Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office is authorized and directed to appropriate from funds of the sheriff's office not otherwise appropriated and to draw a warrant in the sum of \$180,000 payable to Angela Jones, individually and as natural parent and guardian of Kharmilia Ferguson, to compensate her for injuries and damages sustained.

Section 4. The Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office is authorized and directed to appropriate from funds of the sheriff's office not otherwise appropriated and to draw a warrant in the sum of \$180,000 payable to Raymond Ferguson, individually and as natural parent and guardian of Kharmilia Ferguson, to compensate him for injuries and damages sustained.

Section 5. The governmental entity responsible for payment of the warrants shall pay to the Florida Agency for Health Care Administration the amount due under section 409.910, Florida Statutes, prior to disbursing any funds to the claimants. The amount due to the agency shall be equal to all unreimbursed medical payments paid by Medicaid up to the date that this act becomes a law.

Section 6. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.
