This legislation re-creates the Federal Law Enforcement Trust Fund without modification, effective November 4, 2004. The Federal Law Enforcement Trust Fund, FLAIR #77-2-719, is administered by the Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission. This fund was created by Chapter 98-391, Laws of Florida. This bill also provides an effective data consistent with that of other trust funds in the Commission.

The re-creation of the Federal Law Enforcement Trust Fund would provide receipt of proceeds from the sale of property seized in joint state and federal operations of the Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission.
