The pharmacist shall note the б 7 instructions on the file copy of the prescription. The pharmacist shall note the manufacturer of the drug dispensed 8 on the file copy of a written or oral prescription that the 9 10 brand name drug prescribed is medically necessary. Section 3. Section 465.0251, Florida Statutes, is 11 12 created to read: 465.0251 Prescription instructions for generically 13 equivalent drugs. -- Every drug prescription shall contain an 14 15 instruction on whether or not a generically equivalent drug may be substituted in its place, unless substitution is 16 17 permitted under a prior-consent authorization. 18 (1) If a written prescription is involved, the form must have two signature lines at opposite ends on the bottom 19 20 of the form. Under the line at the right side must be clearly printed the words "DISPENSE AS WRITTEN." Under the line at the 21 left side must be clearly printed the words "SUBSTITUTION 22 PERMITTED." The practitioner shall communicate the 23 24 instructions to the pharmacist by signing the appropriate 25 line. A prescription is not valid without the signature of the practitioner on one of these lines. In the case of a 26 27 prescription issued by a practitioner in another state that uses a one-line prescription form or variation thereof, the 28 pharmacist may substitute a generically equivalent drug unless 29 30 otherwise instructed by the practitioner through the use of the words "dispense as written," words of similar meaning, or 31

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some other indication. 1 (2) If an oral prescription is involved, the 2 3 practitioner or the practitioner's agent shall instruct the 4 pharmacist as to whether or not a generically equivalent drug may be substituted in its place.
