25-424-01 A bill to be entitled 1 2 An act relating to the Florida Retirement System; amending s. 121.0515, F.S.; revising 3 4 criteria for membership in the special risk 5 class to include emergency medical technicians 6 and paramedics having supervisory or command 7 authority over other emergency medical technicians and paramedics or having 8 9 supervisory or command authority over such 10 supervisory or command personnel; providing an effective date. 11 12 13 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 14 15 Section 1. Subsection (2) of section 121.0515, Florida 16 Statutes, is amended to read: 17 121.0515 Special risk membership.--(2) CRITERIA.--A member, to be designated as a special 18 19 risk member, must meet the following criteria: 20 (a) The member must be employed as a law enforcement 21 officer and be certified, or required to be certified, in 22 compliance with s. 943.1395; however, sheriffs and elected police chiefs shall be excluded from meeting the certification 23 requirements of this paragraph. 24 In addition, the member's 25 duties and responsibilities must include the pursuit, 26 apprehension, and arrest of law violators or suspected law 27 violators; or the member must be an active member of a bomb 28 disposal unit whose primary responsibility is the location, handling, and disposal of explosive devices; or the member 29 30 must be the supervisor or command officer of a member or 31 members who have such responsibilities; provided, however, 1

1 administrative support personnel, including, but not limited 2 to, those whose primary duties and responsibilities are in 3 accounting, purchasing, legal, and personnel, shall not be 4 included;

5 (b) The member must be employed as a firefighter and 6 be certified, or required to be certified, in compliance with 7 s. 633.35 and be employed solely within the fire department of 8 the employer or agency of state government. In addition, the 9 member's duties and responsibilities must include on-the-scene 10 fighting of fires or direct supervision of firefighting units, 11 or the member must be the supervisor or command officer of a member or members who have such responsibilities; provided, 12 13 however, administrative support personnel, including, but not 14 limited to, those whose primary duties and responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, legal, and personnel, shall not 15 be included; 16

17 (c) The member must be employed as a correctional 18 officer and be certified, or required to be certified, in 19 compliance with s. 943.1395. In addition, the member's 20 primary duties and responsibilities must be the custody, and physical restraint when necessary, of prisoners or inmates 21 within a prison, jail, or other criminal detention facility, 22 or while on work detail outside the facility, or while being 23 24 transported; or the member must be the supervisor or command 25 officer of a member or members who have such responsibilities; provided, however, administrative support personnel, 26 including, but not limited to, those whose primary duties and 27 28 responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, legal, and 29 personnel, shall not be included; however, wardens and assistant wardens, as defined by rule, shall participate in 30 31 the Special Risk Class;

1 (d) The member must be employed by a licensed Advance 2 Life Support (ALS) or Basic Life Support (BLS) employer as an 3 emergency medical technician or a paramedic and be certified in compliance with s. 401.27. In addition, the member's 4 5 primary duties and responsibilities must include on-the-scene б emergency medical care or direct supervision of emergency 7 medical technicians or paramedics, or the member must be the 8 supervisor or command officer of one or more members who have such responsibility. However, administrative support 9 10 personnel, including, but not limited to, those whose primary 11 responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, legal, and personnel, shall not be included; 12 13 (e) The member must be employed as a community-based correctional probation officer and be certified, or required 14 to be certified, in compliance with s. 943.1395. In addition, 15 the member's primary duties and responsibilities must be the 16 17 supervised custody, surveillance, control, investigation, and 18 counseling of assigned inmates, probationers, parolees, or 19 community controllees within the community; or the member must 20 be the supervisor of a member or members who have such 21 responsibilities. Administrative support personnel, including, but not limited to, those whose primary duties and 22 responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, legal 23 24 services, and personnel management, shall not be included; however, probation and parole circuit and deputy circuit 25 administrators shall participate in the Special Risk Class; or 26 27 (f) The member must be employed in one of the 28 following classes and must spend at least 75 percent of his or 29 her time performing duties which involve contact with patients 30 or inmates in a correctional or forensic facility or 31 institution:

Pharmacy manager (class code 5251). Section 2. This act shall take effect October 1, 2001. SENATE SUMMARY Includes emergency medical technicians and paramedics whose duties and responsibilities include supervision or command authority over other emergency medical technicians and paramedics, and those having supervisory or command authority over such supervisory or command personnel, in the special risk class of the Florida Retirement System.
