to wear. 1 2 (b) A violation of this subsection is a nonmoving 3 violation, punishable as provided in s. 318.18. 4 (17) The court may waive, reduce, or suspend payment 5 of any fine imposed under subsection (3) or subsection (16) 6 and may impose any other conditions on the waiver, reduction, 7 or suspension. If the court finds that a person does not have sufficient funds to pay the fine, the court may require the 8 9 performance of a specified number of hours of community 10 service or attendance at a safety seminar.
