Subsection (14) is added to section 18 19 403.707, Florida Statutes, to read: 20 403.707 Permits.--21 (14) Before or on the same day of filing with the 22 department of an application for a permit to construct or 23 substantially modify a solid waste management facility, the 24 applicant shall notify the local government having 25 jurisdiction over the facility of the filing of the 26 application. The applicant also shall publish notice of the 27 filing of the application in a newspaper of general circulation in the area where the facility will be located. 28 Notice shall be given and published in accordance with 29 applicable department rules. The department shall not issue 30 the requested permit until the applicant has provided the 31

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department with proof that the notices required by this subsection have been given. Issuance of a permit does not 2 3 relieve an applicant from compliance with local zoning or land 4 use ordinances, or with any other law, rules, or ordinances. Section 2. Section 403.71851, Florida Statutes, is 5 6 amended to read: 7 403.71851 Electronic recycling Lead-containing materials grants.--The Department of Environmental Protection 8 9 is authorized to use funds from the Solid Waste Management Trust Fund as grants to Florida-based businesses with 5 or 10 more years' experience in electronics recycling that recycle 11 12 electronics such as commercial telephone switching equipment, computers, televisions, lead-acid batteries and other 13 14 lead-containing materials, including products such as 15 televisions and computer monitors and other products that 16 utilize lead-containing cathode ray tubes. This incentive 17 funding shall may be used for demonstration projects with one or more counties for countywide comprehensive electronics 18 19 recycling where that term means recycling that provides service to the private sector, nonprofit organizations, 20 21 governmental agencies and the residential sector. This funding may also be used for grants to counties to develop methods to 22 collect and transport electronics to be recycled provided such 23 24 methods are comprehensive in nature research and development in methods to recover and recycle lead from the environment; 25 26 for innovative technologies and equipment to process and 27 recycle lead-containing materials; and for establishing an 28 infrastructure to collect and transport lead-containing material to Florida-based recycling businesses. 29 30 Section 3. The Department of Environmental Protection shall conduct a comprehensive review of the waste reduction

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and recycling goals set out in this section and other
   <u>legislative requirements</u> in view of reduced available funding
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   for these purposes. The review shall include, but is not
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   limited to, the appropriateness of maintaining, extending, or
   revising the goals; the effectiveness of current programs for
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   meeting the goals; the role of Keep Florida Beautiful, Inc.;
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   the need to continue those programs; alternative techniques
   for improving those programs; and alternative strategies for
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   meeting the needs of the programs. The department shall
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   consult with persons knowledgeable about recycling and waste
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   reduction, including, but not limited to, representatives of
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   local government, the private recycling industry, and private
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   waste management industry. The department shall issue its
   report and recommendations to the Governor, the President of
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   the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives by
    September 30, 2001.
