The Commission on Capital Cases is not designated as the entity that will provide training to the staff attorneys in the CS; the Florida Supreme Court or its designee 25 26 will have that task. 27 The potential for a staff attorney to be assigned to assist in other criminal matters of the circuit court when not needed on capital matters exists in the CS. 28 29 30 31
