1	STATEMENT OF SUBSTANTIAL CHANGES CONTAINED IN
2	COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR CS/SB 842
3	
4	The committee substitute reduces the number of capital case
5	staff attorneys from 25 attorneys to 15 with three attorneys assigned to each appellate district.
6	The attorneys are to be assigned to circuits within the appellate district by the Trial Court Budget Commission.
7	However, a chief judge may request the Trial Court Budget Commission to temporarily assign a capital case staff attorney
8	from another appellate district to the circuit for additional assistance in the trial of capital cases.
9	The capital case staff attorneys in an appellate district are
10	to be hired by the chief judges of the circuits within the appellate district or by the chief judge designated by the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court to perform the hiring.
