Section 1. Subsections (3), (4), and (5) of section 316.1935, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:

316.1935 Fleeing or attempting to elude a law enforcement officer; aggravated fleeing and eluding.--

(3)(a) Any person who willfully flees or attempts to elude a law enforcement officer in an authorized law enforcement patrol vehicle with agency insignia and other jurisdictional markings prominently displayed on the vehicle with siren and lights activated, and during the course of the fleeing or attempted eluding drives at high speed, or in any

manner which demonstrates a wanton disregard for the safety of persons or property commits a felony of the second degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084.

- (b) A person who in the course of a violation of paragraph (a) causes serious bodily injury to another commits aggravated fleeing or eluding of a law enforcement officer, a felony of the first degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084.
- (4) Any person who, in the course of unlawfully leaving or attempting to leave the scene of a crash in violation of s. 316.027 or s. 316.061, having knowledge of an order to stop by a duly authorized law enforcement officer:
- (a) Willfully refuses or fails to stop in compliance with such an order, or having stopped in knowing compliance with such order, willfully flees in an attempt to elude such officer; and
- (b) As a result of such fleeing or eluding, causes injury to another person or causes damage to any property belonging to another person

commits aggravated fleeing or eluding, a felony of the second degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084. For the purposes of this subsection, the felony of aggravated fleeing or eluding constitutes a separate offense for which a person may be charged, in addition to the offense of unlawfully leaving the scene of a crash which the person had been in the course of committing or attempting to commit when the order to stop was given.

318.17 Offenses excepted.--No provision of this chapter is available to a person who is charged with any of the following offenses:

- (1) Fleeing or attempting to elude a police officer, in violation of s. 316.1935;
- (2) Leaving the scene of a crash, in violation of ss. 316.027 and 316.061;
- (3) Driving, or being in actual physical control of, any vehicle while under the influence of alcoholic beverages, any chemical substance set forth in s. 877.111, or any substance controlled under chapter 893, in violation of s. 316.193, or driving with an unlawful blood-alcohol level;
  - (4) Reckless driving, in violation of s. 316.192;
- (5) Making false crash reports, in violation of s.
  316.067;
- (6) Willfully failing or refusing to comply with any lawful order or direction of any police officer or member of the fire department, in violation of s. 316.072(3);
- (7) Obstructing an officer, in violation of s. 316.545(1); or
- (8) Any other offense in chapter 316 which is classified as a criminal violation.

Section 4. For the purpose of incorporating the amendments made by this act to section 316.1935, Florida Statutes, in reference thereto, subsection (1) of section 322.61, Florida Statutes, is reenacted to read:

322.61 Disqualification from operating a commercial motor vehicle.--

- (1) A person who, within a 3-year period, is convicted of two of the following serious traffic violations or any combination thereof, arising in separate incidents committed in a commercial motor vehicle shall, in addition to any other applicable penalties, be disqualified from operating a commercial motor vehicle for a period of 60 days:
- (a) A violation of any state or local law relating to motor vehicle traffic control, other than a parking violation, a weight violation, or a vehicle equipment violation, arising in connection with a crash resulting in death or personal injury to any person;
  - (b) Reckless driving, as defined in s. 316.192;
  - (c) Careless driving, as defined in s. 316.1925;
- (d) Fleeing or attempting to elude a law enforcement officer, as defined in s. 316.1935;
- (e) Unlawful speed of 15 miles per hour or more above the posted speed limit;
- (f) Driving a commercial motor vehicle, owned by such
  person, which is not properly insured;
  - (g) Improper lane change, as defined in s. 316.085; or
  - (h) Following too closely, as defined in s. 316.0895.

Section 5. Section 812.158, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

812.158 Failure of mover to relinquish or place household goods; penalty.--

- (1) As used in this section, the term:
- (a) "Estimate" means a written document provided to a prospective shipper which sets forth the total cost and the basis of such cost related to a shipper's move, which must include, but need not be limited to, transportation services or accessorial services.

- (b) "Household goods" means personal effects or other personal property found in a home, personal residence, other storage facility, or other location of which items the shipper is the owner or agent of the owner. The term includes property held or found in a storage or warehouse facility that is owned or rented by a shipper or shipper's agent. The term does not include freight or personal property moving to or from a factory, store, or other place of business.
- (c) "Mover" means any person who engages in the transportation or shipment of household goods for compensation or any person who hold himself or herself out to the public as engaging in the transportation or shipment of household goods for compensation.
- (d) "Shipper" means any person who uses the services of a mover to transport or ship household goods. The term includes any other person whom a shipper designates in writing.
- (2) A mover may not refuse to relinquish to a shipper any of the shipper's household goods, or fail to place household goods inside a shipper's dwelling, except when the shipper has failed to tender payment in an amount specified in a written contract or estimate signed by the shipper.
- (3) A mover may not refuse to relinquish to a shipper any of the shipper's household goods, or fail to place household goods inside a shipper's dwelling, based upon the mover's refusal to accept a particular form of payment, including, but not limited to, cash, cashier's check, money orders, travelers check, personal checks, credit cards, charge cards, or debit cards, unless the mover clearly and conspicuously discloses in a written estimate or contract the methods of payment which the mover accepts.
