19	(3)(a) The Gold Seal Program shall be developed and
20	implemented by the Governor's Panel on Excellence in Long-Term
21	Care, which shall operate under the authority of the Executive

24	of the original appointments, the terms of all panel members
25	shall expire on September 30, 2001. The panel shall be

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Thereafter, all panel members except those appointed under subparagraphs f. and j. shall be appointed to serve 4-year terms. The panel shall be composed of three persons appointed by the Governor, to include a consumer advocate for senior citizens and two persons with expertise in the fields of quality management, service delivery excellence, or public sector accountability; three persons appointed by the Secretary of Elderly Affairs, to include an active member of a nursing facility family and resident care council and a member of the University Consortium on Aging; the State Long-Term Care Ombudsman; one person appointed by the Florida Life Care Residents Association; one person appointed by the Secretary of Health; two persons appointed by the Secretary of Health Care Administration; one person appointed by the Florida Association of Homes for the Aging; and one person appointed by the Florida Health Care Association. Vacancies on the panel shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointments. A panel member may not be appointed to serve more than two consecutive 4-year terms.

- 2. Panel members shall select the panel chair by a majority vote at the panel's first meeting after all panel members have been appointed.
- 3. For purposes of this paragraph, the term "consumer advocate for senior citizens" means a person who:
- a. Receives no money from the nursing home industry in the form of wages, contributions, or gifts and has no relatives who receive such wages, contributions, or gifts;

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- b. Is not an employee of the Agency for Health Care Administration, the Department of Health, or the Department of Elderly Affairs; and
- c. Is either a member of an organized senior advocacy group or has had or currently has a relative in a nursing home.
- Section 2. Section 400.4195, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:
 - 400.4195 Rebates prohibited; penalties.--
- (1) It is unlawful for any assisted living facility licensed under this part to contract or promise to pay or receive any commission, bonus, kickback, or rebate or engage in any split-fee arrangement in any form whatsoever with any physician, surgeon, organization, agency, or person, either directly or indirectly, for residents referred to an assisted living facility licensed under this part unless the following conditions are met: -
- (a) Payment is made to an independent marketing agency that represents the facility under a nonexclusive contract.
- (b) The independent marketing agency represents multiple facilities with different owners.
- (c) The independent marketing agency clearly indicates to referred residents, prior to referral, all facilities represented by the agency. A facility may employ or contract with persons to market the facility, provided the employee or contract provider clearly indicates that he or she represents the facility.
- (2) A person or agency independent of the facility may provide placement or referral services for a fee to individuals seeking assistance in finding a suitable facility; 31 | however, any fee paid for placement or referral services must

be paid by the individual looking for a facility, not by the facility. (3) A violation of this section shall be considered patient brokering and is punishable as provided in s. 817.505. Section 3. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law. ********** HOUSE SUMMARY Revises membership and terms of the Governor's Panel on Excellence in Long-Term Care. Provides for selection of a panel chair. Defines the term "consumer advocate for panel chair. Defines the term "consumer advocate for senior citizens" for purposes of appointments to the panel. Provides that payments made to an independent marketing agency by an assisted living facility for referral of residents to that facility are not prohibited if the agency represents the facility under a nonexclusive contract and represents multiple facilities with different owners, and clearly indicates to referred residents, prior to referral, all the facilities represented.
