The Legislature finds that the exemption from public-records requirements provided in section 26 27 119.07(3)(ee), Florida Statutes, is a public necessity because law enforcement officers or former law enforcement officers 28 29 can be identified as such by connecting them with their electronic paging device numbers that are used in the course 30 of their employment. The identification of law enforcement 31

1 officers through electronic paging device numbers can compromise investigations, undermine those officers' ability 2 3 to apprehend suspects, and compromise the physical safety of law enforcement officers. Electronic paging device numbers of 4 5 former law enforcement officers, if made public, could also 6 jeopardize on-going investigations, law enforcement informers 7 and contacts, as well as the safety of former law enforcement 8 officers because such numbers could be used to connect a law 9 enforcement officer to an investigation. Consequently, the 10 Legislature finds that electronic paging device numbers of law enforcement officers and former law enforcement officers which 11 12 are used in the course of their employment must be kept confidential. 13 14 Section 3.
