19	agencies or political subdivisions, or any municipality solely
20	because of a prior conviction for a crime. However, a person
21	may be denied employment by the state, any of its agencies or
22	political subdivisions, or any municipality by reason of the
23	prior conviction for a crime if the crime was a felony or
24	first degree misdemeanor and directly related to the position
25	of employment sought.
26	(b) Except as provided in s. 775.16, a person whose
27	civil rights have been restored shall not be disqualified to
28	practice, pursue, or engage in any occupation, trade,
29	vocation, profession, or business for which a license, permit,
30	or certificate is required to be issued by the state, any of
31	its agencies or political subdivisions, or any municipality
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solely because of a prior conviction for a crime. However, a 1 2 person whose civil rights have been restored may be denied a 3 license, permit, or certification to pursue, practice, or engage in an occupation, trade, vocation, profession, or 4 5 business by reason of the prior conviction for a crime if the crime was a felony or first degree misdemeanor and directly 6 7 related to the specific occupation, trade, vocation, 8 profession, or business for which the license, permit, or 9 certificate is sought. 10 (2) (C) 11 This section shall not be applicable to the 12 employment practices of any county or municipality relating to 13 the hiring of personnel for positions deemed to be critical to 14 security or public safety pursuant to ss. 125.580 and 15 166.0442. 16 Section 4.
