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A bill to be entitled

An act relating to capitol security; creating s. 281.401, F.S.; creating the Capitol Complex Security Commission; providing for membership; defining the term "capitol complex"; providing for powers and duties; providing for the application of rules adopted by the commission which are in conflict with chapter 281, F.S.; relieving the Department of Management Services of certain responsibilities; providing an appropriation; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 281.401, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

281.401 Capitol Complex Security Commission; creation; powers and duties. --

There is hereby created the Capitol Complex (1)Security Commission. The commission shall consist of the Governor, the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court, and the Cabinet. The commission shall be chaired by the Governor, if present, then by the President of the Senate if the Governor is not present, then by the Speaker of the House of Representatives if the Governor and the President of the Senate are not present, then by the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court if the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives are not present, then by the senior Cabinet member in order of succession if the Governor, the President of the Senate, the

Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court are not present. For voting purposes, each member of the commission may appoint a designee to represent the commission member at meetings.

- (2) For the purposes of this section, the term
 "capitol complex" means the Capitol, the Senate Office
 Building, the House Office Building, the Knott Building, the
 Pepper Building, the Holland Building, the Supreme Court
 Building, the Historic Capitol, and state-owned lands adjacent thereto.
- comprehensive and ongoing plan for the safety and security of the capitol complex. The commission shall adopt rules, policies, procedures, and operational plans to maintain a reasonable degree of safety and security while assuring reasonable access to buildings and premises within the capitol complex by state officials, employees, and visitors. Such plan and initial rules shall be adopted on or before February 8, 2002.
- (4) The commission may employ an executive director, may employ officers and guards, and may contract with law enforcement agencies and private security firms to provide security and law enforcement services. Sworn officers employed by the commission shall have the authority to bear arms, make arrests, and apply for arrest warrants, provided that all such officers hold certification as law enforcement officers in accordance with the minimum standards and qualifications set forth in s. 943.13 and with the provisions of chapter 110, and any persons employed by the commission who are not certified law enforcement officers shall not be authorized to bear arms or make arrests.

1	(5) To the extent that any rules adopted by the
2	commission are contrary to any other provisions of this
3	chapter, the rules of the commission shall prevail. The
4	Department of Management Services is hereby relieved of
5	responsibility for any area that is expressly assumed by the
6	commission by rule pursuant to this section.
7	(6) The commission shall be housed in the Executive
8	Office of the Governor.
9	Section 2. There is hereby appropriated from the
10	General Revenue Fund to the Executive Office of the Governor
11	an amount sufficient to carry out the provisions of this act.
12	Section 3. This act shall take effect upon becoming a
