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post an appropriate bond as determined by the tax collector, 1 2 using an insurance company acceptable to the tax collector. 3 In lieu of such bond, the tax collector may purchase blanket bonds covering all or selected subagents or may allow a 4 5 subagent to post such other security as is required by the tax collector. б 7 (d) A subagent may sell licenses and permits as are 8 determined by the tax collector at such specific locations within the county and in states contiguous to Florida as will 9 10 best serve the public interest and convenience in obtaining licenses and permits. The commission may uniformly prohibit 11 12 subagents from selling certain licenses or permits. 13 (e) It is unlawful for any person to handle licenses 14 or permits for a fee or compensation of any kind unless she or 15 he has been appointed as a subagent. 16 (f) Any person who willfully violates any of the 17 provisions of this law is guilty of a misdemeanor of the second degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 18 775.083. 19 20 (q) A subagent may charge and receive as her or his compensation 50 cents for each license or permit sold. This 21 22 charge is in addition to the sum required by law to be 23 collected for the sale and issuance of each license or permit. 24 (h) A subagent shall weekly submit payment for and 25 report the sale of licenses and permits. (i) Subagents shall submit an activity report for 26 27 sales made during the reporting period on forms prescribed or approved by the commission. Periodic audits may be performed 28 29 at the discretion of the commission. 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1 county.Subagents shall serve at the pleasure of the 2 commission. The commission may establish, by rule, procedures 3 for <u>the selection and appointment</u> of subagents. The following 4 are requirements for subagents so appointed:

5 (a) The commission may require each subagent to post 6 an appropriate bond as determined by the commission, using an 7 insurance company acceptable to the commission. In lieu of 8 the bond, the commission may purchase blanket bonds covering 9 all or selected subagents or may allow a subagent to post 10 other security as required by the commission.

(b) A subagent may sell licenses and permits as authorized by the commission at specific locations within the county and in states as will best serve the public interest and convenience in obtaining licenses and permits. The commission may prohibit subagents from selling certain licenses or permits.

17 (c) It is unlawful for any person to handle licenses
18 or permits for a fee or compensation of any kind unless he or
19 she has been appointed as a subagent.

20 (d) Any person who willfully violates any of the
21 provisions of this section commits a misdemeanor of the second
22 degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083.

(e) A subagent may charge and receive as his or her compensation 50 cents for each license or permit sold. This charge is in addition to the sum required by law to be collected for the sale and issuance of each license or permit. (f) A subagent shall submit payment for and report the

28 sale of licenses and permits to the commission as prescribed29 by the commission.

30 (g) Subagents shall maintain records of all licenses 31 and permits sold, voided, stolen, or lost. Subagents are 3

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responsible to the commission for the fees for all licenses 1 2 and permits sold and for the value of all licenses and permits 3 reported as lost. Subagents must report all stolen licenses 4 and permits to the appropriate law enforcement agency. The 5 subagent shall submit a written report and a copy of the law enforcement agency's report to the commission within 5 days б 7 after discovering the theft. 8 (h) Subagents shall submit an activity report for sales made during the reporting period on forms prescribed or 9 10 approved by the commission. Periodic audits may be performed 11 at the discretion of the commission. 12 (i) By July 15 of each year, each subagent shall 13 submit to the commission all unissued stamps for the previous 14 year along with a written audit report, on forms prescribed or 15 approved by the commission, on the numbers of the unissued 16 stamps. 17 (2)(3) The Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission or any other law enforcement agency may carry out any 18 investigation necessary to secure information required to 19 20 carry out and enforce this section.
