20	(a) (1) Is elected, appointed, or employed full time by								
21	a municipality, the state, or any political subdivision and is

25	traffic, or highway laws of the state;

her public employer had no agreement providing for workers' 1 2 compensation coverage for that private employment; 3 4 the employee is considered shall be deemed to have been acting 5 within the course of employment. The term "employee" as used б in this subsection section includes all certified supervisory 7 and command personnel whose duties include, in whole or in 8 part, responsibilities for the supervision, training, quidance, and management of full-time law enforcement 9 officers, part-time law enforcement officers, or auxiliary law 10 11 enforcement officers but does not include support personnel 12 employed by the employing agency. 13 (2) If a firefighter as defined by s. 112.191(1)(b) is 14 engaged in extinguishing a fire, or protecting and saving life 15 or property due to a fire in this state in an emergency, and 16 such activities would be considered to be within the course of his or her employment as a firefighter and covered by the 17 employer's workers' compensation coverage except for the fact 18 19 that the firefighter was off duty or that the location of the 20 fire was outside the employer's jurisdiction or area of responsibility, such activities are considered to be within 21 22 the course of employment. This subsection does not apply if the firefighter is performing activities for which he or she 23 24 is paid by another employer or contractor. 25 (3) If an emergency medical technician or paramedic 26 certified under chapter 401 is providing basic life support or 27 advanced life support services, as defined in s. 401.23, in an 28 emergency situation in this state, and such activities would be considered to be within the course of his or her employment 29 as an emergency medical technician or paramedic and covered by 30 the employer's workers' compensation coverage except for the 31

fact that the location of the emergency was outside of the 1 2 employer's jurisdiction or area of responsibility, such 3 activities are considered to be within the course of employment. The provisions of this subsection do not apply if 4 5 the emergency medical technician or paramedic is performing 6 activities for which he or she is paid by another employer or 7 contractor. Section 2. It is declared by the Legislature that 8 9 firefighters perform state and municipal functions, that it is their duty to protect life and property at their own risk and 10 11 peril, and that their activities are vital to the public 12 safety. Therefore, the Legislature declares that it fulfills 13 an important state interest to provide workers' compensation coverage to firefighters while engaged in extinguishing a 14 fire, or protecting and saving life or property due to a fire 15 16 in this state while off duty or engaging in such activities at 17 a fire located outside the employer's jurisdiction or area of responsibility. It is further declared by the Legislature that 18 19 emergency medical technicians and paramedics perform municipal 20 and state functions, that it is their duty to protect and preserve life at their own risk and peril, and that their 21 22 activities are vital to the public health, safety, and welfare. Therefore, the Legislature declares that it fulfills 23 an important state interest to provide workers' compensation 24 coverage to emergency medical technicians and paramedics while 25 26 engaged in basic life support and advanced life support 27 services due to an emergency in this state that is outside of 28 their employer's jurisdiction or area of responsibility. Pursuant to Section 18, Article VII of the State Constitution, 29 the Legislature determines and declares that the provisions of 30 this act fulfill an important state interest. 31
