Subsection (2) of section 121.0515, Florida 11 Statutes, is amended to read: 121.0515 Special risk membership.--12 13 (2) CRITERIA.--A member, to be designated as a special 14 risk member, must meet the following criteria: 15 (a) The member must be employed as a law enforcement 16 officer and be certified, or required to be certified, in 17 compliance with s. 943.1395; however, sheriffs and elected 18 police chiefs shall be excluded from meeting the certification 19 requirements of this paragraph. In addition, the member's 20 duties and responsibilities must include the pursuit, apprehension, and arrest of law violators or suspected law 21 22 violators; or the member must be an active member of a bomb 23 disposal unit whose primary responsibility is the location, handling, and disposal of explosive devices; or the member 24 25 must be the supervisor or command officer of a member or 26 members who have such responsibilities; provided, however, 27 administrative support personnel, including, but not limited 28 to, those whose primary duties and responsibilities are in 29 accounting, purchasing, legal, and personnel, shall not be included; 30 31

3 (d) The member must be employed by a licensed Advance 4 Life Support (ALS) or Basic Life Support (BLS) employer as an 5 emergency medical technician or a paramedic and be certified б in compliance with s. 401.27. In addition, the member's 7 primary duties and responsibilities must include on-the-scene 8 emergency medical care or direct supervision of emergency medical technicians or paramedics, or the member must be the 9 10 supervisor or command officer of one or more members who have 11 such responsibility. However, administrative support personnel, including, but not limited to, those whose primary 12 responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, legal, and 13 14 personnel, shall not be included;

15 (e) The member must be employed as a community-based correctional probation officer and be certified, or required 16 17 to be certified, in compliance with s. 943.1395.
