On page 3, line 16, delete that line

and insert: provided by law. Sealed investigative incident reports often contain information that is unsubstantiated, unverifiable, or found to be untrue. As a result, the information contained in these reports does not rise to the level where charges are brought. If these records are available for inspection or copying by the public, persons who are the subjects of these reports could be subjected to public humiliation, social ostracism or employment discrimination, based upon hearsay, unfounded allegations, or untruths. While this information may be of some use in the limited circumstances of employment or licensing, its availability to the public invades the privacy of the subject of the report.
