state wherever the public has a right to travel by motor 1 2 vehicle. The Division of the Florida Highway Patrol may employ 3 as a traffic accident investigation officer any individual who 4 successfully completes at least 200 hours of instruction in 5 traffic accident investigation and court presentation through the Selective Traffic Enforcement Program as approved by the 6 7 Criminal Justice Standards and Training Commission and funded through the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration or 8 a similar program approved by the commission, but who does not 9 10 necessarily meet the uniform minimum standards established by the commission for law enforcement officers or auxiliary law 11 12 enforcement officers under chapter 943. Any such traffic 13 accident investigation officer who makes an investigation at the scene of a traffic accident may issue traffic citations, 14 15 based upon personal investigation, when he or she has reasonable and probable grounds to believe that a person who 16 17 was involved in the accident committed an offense under this chapter, chapter 319, chapter 320, or chapter 322 in 18 connection with the accident. This paragraph does not permit 19 the carrying of firearms or other weapons, nor do such 20 officers have arrest authority other than for the issuance of 21 22 a traffic citation as authorized in this paragraph. University police officers shall have authority to 23 b. 24 enforce all of the traffic laws of this state when such 25 violations occur on or about any property or facilities that are under the guidance, supervision, regulation, or control of 26 a state university, a direct-support organization of such 27 state university, or any other organization controlled by the 28 29 state university or a direct-support organization of the state 30 university System, except that traffic laws may be enforced 31 off-campus when hot pursuit originates on or adjacent to any

c. Community college police officers shall have the authority to enforce all the traffic laws of this state only when such violations occur on any property or facilities that are under the guidance, supervision, regulation, or control of the community college system.

7 d. Police officers employed by an airport authority
8 shall have the authority to enforce all of the traffic laws of
9 this state only when such violations occur on any property or
10 facilities that are owned or operated by an airport authority.

11 An airport authority may employ as a parking (I) 12 enforcement specialist any individual who successfully 13 completes a training program established and approved by the 14 Criminal Justice Standards and Training Commission for parking 15 enforcement specialists but who does not otherwise meet the uniform minimum standards established by the commission for 16 17 law enforcement officers or auxiliary or part-time officers under s. 943.12. Nothing in this sub-sub-subparagraph shall be 18 construed to permit the carrying of firearms or other weapons, 19 20 nor shall such parking enforcement specialist have arrest 21 authority.

(II) A parking enforcement specialist employed by an airport authority is authorized to enforce all state, county, and municipal laws and ordinances governing parking only when such violations are on property or facilities owned or operated by the airport authority employing the specialist, by appropriate state, county, or municipal traffic citation.

e. The Office of Agricultural Law Enforcement of the
Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services shall have the
authority to enforce traffic laws of this state only as
authorized by the provisions of chapter 570. However, nothing

in this section shall expand the authority of the Office of
 Agricultural Law Enforcement at its agricultural inspection
 stations to issue any traffic tickets except those traffic
 tickets for vehicles illegally passing the inspection station.

5 f. School safety officers shall have the authority to 6 enforce all of the traffic laws of this state when such 7 violations occur on or about any property or facilities which 8 are under the guidance, supervision, regulation, or control of 9 the district school board.

2. An agency of the state as described in subparagraph
 1. is prohibited from establishing a traffic citation quota. A
 violation of this subparagraph is not subject to the penalties
 provided in chapter 318.

Any disciplinary action taken or performance 14 3. 15 evaluation conducted by an agency of the state as described in subparagraph 1. of a law enforcement officer's traffic 16 17 enforcement activity must be in accordance with written work-performance standards. Such standards must be approved by 18 the agency and any collective bargaining unit representing 19 such law enforcement officer. A violation of this subparagraph 20 is not subject to the penalties provided in chapter 318. 21

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(2) COUNTIES.--

The sheriff's office of each county may employ as 23 (b) 24 a traffic crash investigation officer any individual who 25 successfully completes at least 200 hours of instruction in traffic crash investigation and court presentation through the 26 27 Selective Traffic Enforcement Program (STEP) as approved by the Criminal Justice Standards and Training Commission and 28 funded through the National Highway Traffic Safety 29 Administration (NHTSA) or a similar program approved by the 30 31 commission, but who does not necessarily otherwise meet the

15 (b) The police department of a chartered municipality may employ as a traffic crash investigation officer any 16 17 individual who successfully completes at least 200 hours of instruction in traffic crash investigation and court 18 presentation through the Selective Traffic Enforcement Program 19 20 (STEP) as approved by the Criminal Justice Standards and Training Commission and funded through the National Highway 21 22 Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) or a similar program approved by the commission, but who does not otherwise meet 23 24 the uniform minimum standards established by the commission for law enforcement officers or auxiliary law enforcement 25 officers under chapter 943. Any such traffic crash 26 27 investigation officer who makes an investigation at the scene of a traffic crash is authorized to issue traffic citations 28 29 when, based upon personal investigation, he or she has reasonable and probable grounds to believe that a person 30 31 involved in the crash has committed an offense under the

A chartered municipality or its authorized 8 agency or instrumentality may employ as a parking enforcement 9 specialist any individual who successfully completes a 10 training program established and approved by the Criminal Justice Standards and Training Commission for parking 11 12 enforcement specialists, but who does not otherwise meet the 13 uniform minimum standards established by the commission for 14 law enforcement officers or auxiliary or part-time officers 15 under s. 943.12.

2. A parking enforcement specialist employed by a 16 17 chartered municipality or its authorized agency or instrumentality is authorized to enforce all state, county, 18 and municipal laws and ordinances governing parking within the 19 20 boundaries of the municipality employing the specialist, by appropriate state, county, or municipal traffic citation. 21 22 Nothing in this paragraph shall be construed to permit the 23 carrying of firearms or other weapons, nor shall such a 24 parking enforcement specialist have arrest authority. 25 3. A parking enforcement specialist employed pursuant to this subsection may not carry firearms or other weapons or 26 27 have arrest authority. Section 10. (1) The commissioner may create an Office of 1 2 Agricultural Law Enforcement under the supervision of a senior manager exempt under s. 110.205 in the Senior Management 3 4 Service. The commissioner may designate law enforcement 5 officers, as necessary, to enforce any criminal law or conduct any criminal investigation or to enforce the provisions of any б 7 statute or any other laws of this state relating to any matter 8 over which the department has jurisdiction or which occurs on property owned, managed, or occupied by the department. 9 10 Officers appointed under this section have the primary 11 responsibility for enforcing laws relating to agriculture and 12 consumer services as outlined below and violations of law that 13 threaten the overall security and safety of this state's 14 agriculture and consumer services. Those matters include The 15 primary responsibilities include the enforcement of laws 16 relating to: 17 (a) Domesticated animals, including livestock, 18 poultry, aquaculture products, and other wild or domesticated animals or animal products. 19 20 (b) Farms, farm equipment, livery tack, citrus or citrus products, or horticultural products. 21 22 (c) Trespass, littering, forests, forest fires, and 23 open burning. 24 (d) Damage to or theft of forest products. 25 (e) Enforcement of a marketing order.
