3 ARTICLE XII
4 SCHEDULE
5 SECTION 26. Term limits.--The amendment to Section 4
6 of Article VI denying ballot access for re-election to any
7 cabinet officer or state legislator who will have served (or,
8 but for resignation, would have served) in that office for 12
9 consecutive years, rather than 8 consecutive years, shall take
10 effect upon approval by the voters and shall apply only to
11 those officers whose consecutive years in office begin in
12 November 2002 or thereafter.

13 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in accordance with the
14 requirements of section 101.161, Florida Statutes, the title
15 and substance of the amendment proposed herein shall appear on
16 the ballot as follows:

17 TERM LIMITS
18 Increases, from 8 to 12, the number of consecutive
19 years a state legislator or any Cabinet officer may serve in
20 that office before being denied the right to have his or her
21 name appear on the ballot for re-election to that office.
22 Applies to those officers whose consecutive years in office
23 begin in November 2002 or thereafter. Removes provisions that
24 apply term limits by means of ballot access to members of
25 Congress, which the United States Supreme Court has determined
26 violate the Federal Constitution.
