An act relating to required instruction in the public schools; amending s. 233.061, F.S.; providing that the character-development program shall be required instruction in kindergarten through grade 12; requiring curriculum development or adoption and approval; amending s. 233.0612, F.S., relating to authorized instruction, to conform; providing effective dates.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Paragraph (q) of subsection (2) of section 233.061, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

233.061 Required instruction.--

- (2) Members of the instructional staff of the public schools, subject to the rules and regulations of the commissioner, the state board, and the school board, shall teach efficiently and faithfully, using the books and materials required, following the prescribed courses of study, and employing approved methods of instruction, the following:
- (q) A character-development program in the elementary schools, similar to Character First or Character Counts. Such a program must be secular in nature and must stress such character qualities as attentiveness, patience, and initiative. Beginning in school year 2004-2005, the character-development program shall be required in kindergarten through grade 12. Each district school board shall develop or adopt a curriculum for the character-development program which shall be submitted to the

Department of Education for approval. The character-development curriculum shall stress the qualities of patriotism, responsibility, citizenship, kindness, respect, honesty, self-control, tolerance, and cooperation. Section 2. Effective July 1, 2004, subsection (1) of section 233.0612, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 233.0612 Authorized instruction.--Each school district may provide students with programs and instruction at the appropriate grade levels in areas including, but not limited to, the following: (1) Character development, Ethics, and law education. Section 3. Except as otherwise provided herein, this act shall take effect July 1, 2002.
