A bill to be entitled

An act relating to the Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Program; amending s. 240.4015, F.S., relating to the Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Testing Program; revising provisions relating to the use of specified examinations for purposes of awarding college credit; clarifying provisions relating to the award of credit; deleting obsolete provisions; revising provisions relating to payment for examinations; requiring the Department of Education to provide a financial incentive to students for passing examinations; authorizing Florida Gold Seal Vocational Scholars to take up to five approved examinations; requiring the department to contract for centralized administrative services; providing a limitation to the cost associated with contracting for centralized administrative services; providing for funding; amending s. 240.40203, F.S.; revising provisions relating to the maximum number of credit hours for which a student may receive a Florida Bright Futures Scholarship; requiring Florida Academic Scholars and Florida Merit Scholars award recipients to meet certain requirements in order to renew scholarships; amending s. 240.40207, F.S.; conforming provisions; providing an effective date.

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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Section 1. Section 240.4015, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

240.4015 Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Testing Program.--

- Committee shall identify the minimum scores, maximum credit, and course or courses for which credit is to be awarded for each College Level Examination Program (CLEP) general examination, CLEP subject examination, College Board Advanced Placement Program examination, and International Baccalaureate examination, or other nationally recognized examination approved by the Florida Board of Education. In addition, the Articulation Coordinating Committee shall identify such courses in the general education core curriculum of each state university and community college.
- (2) Each community college and state university must award credit for specific courses for which competency has been demonstrated by successful passage of one of these examinations unless the award of credit duplicates credit already awarded. Community colleges and universities may not exempt students from courses without the award of credit if competencies have been so demonstrated. If a student achieves a passing score as identified by the Articulation Coordinating Committee on an examination required by this section, the student shall receive credit equivalent to successfully completing the equivalent course as identified by the Articulation Coordinating Committee in a state university or community college, provided that such credit is not duplicative of credit already earned by the student.
- (3) Beginning with initial award recipients for the 2002-2003 academic year and continuing thereafter, students

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eligible for a Florida Academic Scholars award or a Florida Merit Scholars award who are admitted to and enroll in a community college or state university shall, prior to registering for courses that may be earned through a CLEP examination or an approved examination and no later than registration for the their second term, complete at least five examinations from those specified in subsection (1) in any of the following areas: English; humanities; mathematics; natural sciences; and social sciences. Successful completion of dual enrollment courses, Advanced Placement examinations, and International Baccalaureate examinations in these areas may be used to taken prior to high school graduation satisfy this requirement. The Articulation Coordinating Committee shall identify the examinations that satisfy each component of this requirement.

(4) Initial award recipients for the 2001-2002 academic year who are eligible for a Florida Academic Scholars award or a Florida Merit Scholars award and who are admitted to and enroll in a community college or state university may choose, prior to registering for courses that may be earned through CLEP examination, to complete up to five CLEP examinations, one in each of the following areas: English; humanities; mathematics; natural sciences; and social sciences.

(5) Each community college and state university shall pay for the CLEP examinations required pursuant to this section from the funds appropriated from the Educational Enhancement Trust Fund. Institutions shall pay no more than 29 \$46 per examination for the program, which shall include access to a student guide to prepare for the test. The 31 Department of Education shall negotiate with the College Board

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for a reduced rate for the examinations. The institution shall not charge the student for preparation and administration of the test, access to a student guide to prepare for the test, or recordkeeping and reporting of each student's test results to the department.

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(4) The credit awarded pursuant to this section to students who are enrolled in associate or baccalaureate degree level programs shall apply toward the 120 hours of college credit required pursuant to s. 240.115(6).

- (5) The Department of Education shall negotiate with examination providers to provide for examinations and test administration services on a cost-effective, lowest cost per test available basis.
- (6) The Department of Education shall provide a \$50 incentive to each student for each CLEP examination or approved examination passed that is required in this section.
- (7) Florida Gold Seal Vocational Scholars award recipients may choose, prior to registering for courses in which credit may be earned through an approved examination, to complete up to five approved examinations in any of the following areas: English; humanities; mathematics; natural sciences; and social sciences. Such students who achieve a passing score on a CLEP examination or an approved examination shall receive credit equivalent to successfully completing the equivalent course as provided in subsection (2). Florida Gold Seal Vocational Scholars who achieve a passing score on an approved examination shall also receive the \$50 per test incentive provided in subsection (6).
- (7) The maximum number of credit hours for which a student is eligible to receive a Florida Bright Futures

Scholarship Program award shall be reduced by the number of hours for which credit is awarded pursuant to this section.

- Department of Education shall administer this testing program for all students in the state in order to track and annually report on the effectiveness of the program., and These reports shall include information on the number of students participating in the program; the number of CLEP examinations taken and the passage rate of Florida Academic Scholars, and Florida Merit Scholars, and Florida Gold Seal Vocational Scholars award recipients; the use of Advanced Placement and International Baccalaureate examinations and dual enrollment courses to satisfy the requirements of the program; and the course credit provided.
- (9) The Department of Education shall contract for centralized administrative services for this program, to include a website with appropriate links for student registration; delivery of online test preparation, study guides, and practice tests; recordkeeping; and technical support. The cost per student associated with contracting for centralized administrative services shall not exceed the cost incurred to administer the Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Testing Program in the 2001-2002 fiscal year.
- (10) Funding for the Florida Bright Futures
  Scholarship Testing Program as set forth in this section must
  be allocated from the Educational Enhancement Trust Fund and
  must be provided for after allocations to the Classrooms First
  Program and the Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Program but
  prior to the calculation of allocations for disbursement to
  other educational entities. Such funding shall include, but
  is not limited to, payment for the required examinations,

 payment for the optional examinations, payment of the
incentives, and payment for the contracted administrative
services.

Section 2. Subsection (2) of section 240.40203, Florida Statutes, is amended, and subsection (3) is added to said section, to read:

240.40203 Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Program; student eligibility requirements for renewal awards.--

- baccalaureate degree level a program that terminates in an associate degree or a baccalaureate degree may receive an award for not more than the a maximum of 110 percent of the number of credit hours required to complete the program. A student who is enrolled in a program that terminates in a technical certificate may receive an award for a maximum of 110 percent of the credit hours or clock hours required to complete the program up to 90 credit hours. A student who transfers from one of these program levels to another becomes eligible for the higher of the two credit hour limits.
- (3) Beginning with the initial award recipients for the 2002-2003 academic year and continuing thereafter, Florida Academic Scholars and Florida Merit Scholars award recipients must also have met the required test requirements in s. 240.4015(3) in order to renew the scholarship.

Section 3. Subsection (4) of section 240.40207, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

240.40207 Florida Gold Seal Vocational Scholars award.—The Florida Gold Seal Vocational Scholars award is created within the Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Program to recognize and reward academic achievement and vocational

preparation by high school students who wish to continue their education.

(4) A student may earn a Florida Gold Seal Vocational Scholarship for 110 percent of the number of credit hours required to complete the program, up to 90 credit hours or the equivalent. A Florida Gold Seal Scholar who has a cumulative grade point average of 2.75 in all postsecondary education work attempted may apply for a Florida Merit Scholars award at any renewal period. All other provisions of that program apply, and the credit-hour limitation must be calculated by subtracting from the student's total eligibility the number of credit hours the student attempted while earning the Gold Seal Vocational Scholarship.

Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 2002.
