313-2042-02 A bill to be entitled 1 2 An act relating to voter registration; amending 3 s. 97.052, F.S.; authorizing the voter registration application to be reproduced; 4 5 modifying information requested on the voter registration application; amending s. 97.057, б 7 F.S.; requiring the Department of Highway 8 Safety and Motor Vehicles to forward unsigned voter registration applications to the 9 supervisors of elections; amending s. 97.058, 10 11 F.S.; modifying a voter registration agency's duties with respect to incompleted voter 12 13 registration applications; amending s. 97.071, 14 F.S.; removing the requirement that the 15 supervisor of election's name appear on voter 16 identification cards; amending s. 97.1031, F.S.; providing for electors to change their 17 18 address on the voter registration rolls by 19 telephonic or electronic means; amending s. 20 98.0977, F.S.; providing for the removal from the registration rolls of the names of persons 21 22 convicted of a felony or adjudicated mentally 23 incompetent; providing for a hearing; providing 24 an effective date. 25 26 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 27 Section 1. Subsections (1) and (2) of section 97.052, 28 Florida Statutes, are amended to read: 29 97.052 Uniform statewide voter registration 30 31 application.--1

1 (1)The department shall prescribe a uniform statewide 2 voter registration application for use in this state. 3 The uniform statewide voter registration (a) application must be accepted for any one or more of the 4 5 following purposes: б 1. Initial registration. 7 Change of address. 2. 3. Change of party affiliation. 8 9 4. Change of name. 10 5. Replacement of voter registration identification 11 card. 12 (b) The department is responsible for printing the 13 uniform statewide voter registration application and the voter registration application form prescribed by the Federal 14 Election Commission pursuant to the National Voter 15 Registration Act of 1993. The applications and forms must be 16 17 distributed, upon request, to the following: 18 Individuals seeking to register to vote. 1. 19 2. Individuals or groups conducting voter registration 20 programs. A charge of 1 cent per application shall be assessed 21 on requests for 10,000 or more applications. The Department of Highway Safety and Motor 22 3. 23 Vehicles. 24 4. Voter registration agencies. 5. Armed forces recruitment offices. 25 Qualifying educational institutions. 26 6. 27 Supervisors, who must make the applications and 7. 28 forms available in the following manner: 29 By distributing the applications and forms in their а. 30 offices to any individual or group. 31

1 b. By distributing the applications and forms at other 2 locations designated by each supervisor. 3 By mailing the applications and forms to applicants c. upon the request of the applicant. 4 5 (c) The uniform statewide voter registration б application may not be reproduced by any private individual or 7 group. However, such reproductions must be in the same format 8 as the uniform statewide application. 9 The uniform statewide voter registration (2) 10 application must be designed to elicit the following 11 information from the applicant: (a) Full name. 12 (b) Date of birth. 13 (c) Address of legal residence. 14 (d) Mailing address, if different. 15 (e) County of legal residence. 16 17 (f) Address of property for which the applicant has 18 been granted a homestead exemption, if any. 19 (g) Race or ethnicity that best describes the 20 applicant: 21 1. American Indian or Alaskan Native. 2. Asian or Pacific Islander. 22 3. Black, not Hispanic. 23 24 4. White, not Hispanic. 25 5. Hispanic. (h) State or country of birth. 26 27 (i)<del>(h)</del> Sex. 28 (j)<del>(i)</del> Party affiliation. 29 (k) (j) Whether the applicant needs assistance in 30 voting. 31 (1)(k) Name and address where last registered. 3

1 (m)(1) Last four digits of the applicant's social 2 security number. 3 (n) (m) Florida driver's license number or the identification number from a Florida identification card 4 5 issued under s. 322.051. б (o)(n) Telephone number (optional). 7 (p)(o) Signature of applicant under penalty for false 8 swearing pursuant to s. 104.011, by which the person 9 subscribes to the oath required by s. 3, Art. VI of the State Constitution and s. 97.051, and swears or affirms that the 10 11 information contained in the registration application is true. (q) (p) Whether the application is being used for 12 13 initial registration, to update a voter registration record, 14 or to request a replacement registration identification card. 15 (r) (q) Whether the applicant is a citizen of the United States. 16 17 (s) (r) That the applicant has not been convicted of a felony or, if convicted, has had his or her civil rights 18 19 restored. 20 (t) (t) (s) That the applicant has not been adjudicated mentally incapacitated with respect to voting or, if so 21 22 adjudicated, has had his or her right to vote restored. 23 24 The registration form must be in plain language and designed 25 so that convicted felons whose civil rights have been restored and persons who have been adjudicated mentally incapacitated 26 and have had their voting rights restored are not required to 27 28 reveal their prior conviction or adjudication. 29 Section 2. Subsection (2) of section 97.057, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 30 31

1 97.057 Voter registration by the Department of Highway 2 Safety and Motor Vehicles .--3 The Department of Highway Safety and Motor (2) Vehicles shall: 4 5 (a) Notify each individual, orally or in writing, 6 that: 7 Information gathered for the completion of a 1. 8 driver's license or identification card application, renewal, 9 or change of address can be automatically transferred to a 10 voter registration application; 11 2. If additional information and a signature are provided, the voter registration application will be completed 12 13 and sent to the proper election authority; Information provided can also be used to update a 14 3. voter registration record; 15 4. All declinations will remain confidential and may 16 17 be used only for voter registration purposes; and 18 5. The particular driver license office in which the 19 person applies to register to vote or updates a voter 20 registration record will remain confidential and may be used 21 only for voter registration purposes. (b) Require a driver's license examiner to inquire 22 orally, or inquire in writing if the applicant is hearing 23 24 impaired, and whether the applicant wishes to register to vote or update a voter registration record during the completion of 25 a driver's license or identification card application, 26 27 renewal, or change of address. 28 1. If the applicant chooses to register to vote or to 29 update a voter registration record: 30 a. All applicable information received by the 31 Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles in the course 5

1 of filling out the forms necessary under subsection (1) must 2 be transferred to a voter registration application; 3 The additional necessary information must be h obtained by the driver's license examiner and must not 4 5 duplicate any information already obtained while completing б the forms required under subsection (1); and 7 c. A voter registration application with all of the 8 applicant's voter registration information must be presented 9 to the applicant to sign. 10 2. If the applicant declines to register to vote, 11 update the applicant's voter registration record, or change the applicant's address by either orally declining or by 12 failing to sign the voter registration application, the 13 Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles must keep the 14 declination for 2 years. The department shall forward any 15 unsigned voter registration application to the appropriate 16 17 supervisor of elections within 5 days after receipt. Section 3. Subsection (7) of section 97.058, Florida 18 19 Statutes, is amended to read: 20 97.058 Voter registration agencies.--(7) A voter registration agency must retain 21 declinations for a period of 2 years, during which time the 22 declinations are not considered a record of the client 23 24 pursuant to the laws governing the agency's records. However, 25 a voter registration agency must forward a copy of each incompleted voter registration application within 5 days after 26 27 receipt to the appropriate supervisor of elections. Section 4. Subsection (1) of section 97.071, Florida 28 29 Statutes, is amended to read: 30 97.071 Registration identification card.--31

1 (1) A registration identification card must be 2 furnished to all voters registering under the permanent single 3 registration system and must contain: (a) Voter's registration number. 4 5 (b) Date of registration. б (c) Full name. 7 (d) Party affiliation. (e) Date of birth. 8 (f) Race or ethnicity, if provided by the applicant. 9 10 (g) Sex, if provided by the applicant. 11 (h) Address of legal residence. (i) Precinct number. 12 13 Name Signature of supervisor. (j) (k) Place for voter's signature. 14 15 (1) Other information deemed necessary by the 16 department. 17 Section 5. Subsection (1) of section 97.1031, Florida 18 Statutes, is amended to read: 19 97.1031 Notice of change of residence within the same 20 county, change of name, or change of party .--21 (1) When an elector moves from the address named on that person's voter registration record to another address 22 within the same county, the elector must notify provide a 23 24 signed, written notification of such move to the supervisor and obtain a registration identification card reflecting the 25 new address of legal residence. Notification may be made by a 26 27 signed, written notice, or by telephonic or electronic means, 28 in which case the elector's birthdate must be included. 29 Section 6. Subsection (3) of section 98.0977, is 30 amended to read: 31

1 98.0977 Statewide voter registration database; 2 development and maintenance. --3 (3)(a) In administering the database, each supervisor of elections shall compare registration information provided 4 5 by a voter with information held by the Department of Law б Enforcement, the Board of Executive Clemency, the Office of 7 Vital Statistics, and other relevant sources. 8 (b) The supervisor of elections shall remove from the 9 registration rolls the name of any deceased person. 10 (c) Information on the statewide voter registration 11 database which indicates that a voter in one county has subsequently registered to vote in another shall be considered 12 a written request to have the voter's name removed from the 13 registration rolls of the first county, and the supervisor 14 shall remove that voter's name from the rolls. 15 (d) If the supervisor of elections finds information 16 that suggests that a voter has been convicted of a felony and 17 has not had his or her civil rights restored or has been 18 19 adjudicated mentally incompetent and has not had his or her 20 right to vote restored is ineligible to register to vote, the 21 supervisor of elections shall notify the voter by certified United States mail. The notification shall contain a 22 statement concerning as to the reason for the voter's 23 24 potential ineligibility to register to vote and shall request information from the voter on forms provided by the supervisor 25 of elections in order to make a final determination on the 26 27 voter's eligibility. 28 e. As an alternative, the voter may attend a hearing 29 at a time and place specified in the notice. If there is 30 evidence that the notice was not received, notice must be given once by publication in a newspaper of general 31 8

1 circulation in the county. The notice must plainly state that the voter is potentially ineligible to be registered to vote 2 3 and must state a time and place for the person to appear to show cause why his or her name should not be removed from the 4 5 voter registration rolls.After reviewing the information б requested by the supervisor of elections and provided by the 7 voter, if the supervisor of elections determines that the 8 voter is not eligible to vote under the laws of this state, the supervisor of elections shall notify the voter by 9 10 certified United States mail that he or she has been found 11 ineligible to register to vote in this state, shall state the reason for the ineligibility, and shall inform the voter that 12 13 he or she has been will be removed from the voter registration 14 rolls. The supervisor shall remove from the voter registration 15 rolls the name of any voter who fails to respond within 30 days to the notice sent by certified mail or to attend the 16 17 hearing. 1. Upon hearing all evidence, the supervisor must 18 19 determine whether there is sufficient evidence to strike the 20 person's name from the registration books. If the supervisor determines that there is sufficient evidence, he or she must 21 22 strike the name. 2. Appeal may be taken to the circuit court in the 23 24 county where the person was registered. Notice of appeal must 25 be filed within the time and in the manner provided by the Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure and acts as supersedeas. 26 27 Trial in the circuit court is de novo and governed by the 28 rules of that court. Unless the person shows that his or her 29 name was erroneously or illegally stricken from the 30 registration books or that he or she is indigent, the person must bear the costs of the trial in the circuit court. 31
