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30	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
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1 Section 1. Subsections (1) and (2) of section 97.052, Florida Statutes, are amended to read: 2 3 97.052 Uniform statewide voter registration 4 application.--5 (1) The department shall prescribe a uniform statewide б voter registration application for use in this state. 7 (a) The uniform statewide voter registration 8 application must be accepted for any one or more of the 9 following purposes: 10 1. Initial registration. 11 2. Change of address. 3. Change of party affiliation. 12 13 4. Change of name. Replacement of voter registration identification 14 5. 15 card. (b) The department is responsible for printing the 16 17 uniform statewide voter registration application and the voter registration application form prescribed by the Federal 18 19 Election Commission pursuant to the National Voter Registration Act of 1993. The applications and forms must be 20 21 distributed, upon request, to the following: 1. Individuals seeking to register to vote. 22 23 Individuals or groups conducting voter registration 2. 24 programs. A charge of 1 cent per application shall be assessed on requests for 10,000 or more applications. 25 26 The Department of Highway Safety and Motor 3. 27 Vehicles. 28 4. Voter registration agencies. 29 5. Armed forces recruitment offices. 30 6. Qualifying educational institutions. 31 2

1 7. Supervisors, who must make the applications and 2 forms available in the following manner: 3 By distributing the applications and forms in their а. offices to any individual or group. 4 5 By distributing the applications and forms at other b. б locations designated by each supervisor. 7 By mailing the applications and forms to applicants c. 8 upon the request of the applicant. 9 (c) The uniform statewide voter registration 10 application may not be reproduced by any private individual or 11 group. However, such reproductions must be in the same format as the uniform statewide application. 12 The uniform statewide voter registration 13 (2) application must be designed to elicit the following 14 information from the applicant: 15 (a) Full name. 16 17 (b) Date of birth. (c) Address of legal residence. 18 19 (d) Mailing address, if different. (e) County of legal residence. 20 21 (f) Address of property for which the applicant has been granted a homestead exemption, if any. 22 23 (g) Race or ethnicity that best describes the 24 applicant: 1. American Indian or Alaskan Native. 25 2. Asian or Pacific Islander. 26 27 3. Black, not Hispanic. White, not Hispanic. 28 4. 29 5. Hispanic. (h) State or country of birth. 30 31 (i)(h) Sex.

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1 (j)(i) Party affiliation. 2 (k) (j) Whether the applicant needs assistance in 3 voting. 4 (1) (k) Name and address where last registered. 5 (m)(1) Last four digits of the applicant's social б security number. 7 (n) (m) Florida driver's license number or the 8 identification number from a Florida identification card issued under s. 322.051. 9 10 (o)(n) Telephone number (optional). 11 (p)(o) Signature of applicant under penalty for false swearing pursuant to s. 104.011, by which the person 12 13 subscribes to the oath required by s. 3, Art. VI of the State Constitution and s. 97.051, and swears or affirms that the 14 information contained in the registration application is true. 15 (q) (p) Whether the application is being used for 16 17 initial registration, to update a voter registration record, or to request a replacement registration identification card. 18 19 (r) (q) Whether the applicant is a citizen of the 20 United States. (s) (r) That the applicant has not been convicted of a 21 22 felony or, if convicted, has had his or her civil rights restored. 23 24 (t) (t) (s) That the applicant has not been adjudicated 25 mentally incapacitated with respect to voting or, if so adjudicated, has had his or her right to vote restored. 26 27 28 The registration form must be in plain language and designed 29 so that convicted felons whose civil rights have been restored and persons who have been adjudicated mentally incapacitated 30 31

1 and have had their voting rights restored are not required to 2 reveal their prior conviction or adjudication. 3 Section 2. Subsection (2) of section 97.057, Florida 4 Statutes, is amended to read: 5 97.057 Voter registration by the Department of Highway б Safety and Motor Vehicles .--7 (2) The Department of Highway Safety and Motor 8 Vehicles shall: 9 (a) Notify each individual, orally or in writing, 10 that: 11 Information gathered for the completion of a 1. driver's license or identification card application, renewal, 12 13 or change of address can be automatically transferred to a voter registration application; 14 2. If additional information and a signature are 15 provided, the voter registration application will be completed 16 17 and sent to the proper election authority; 3. Information provided can also be used to update a 18 19 voter registration record; 20 4. All declinations will remain confidential and may 21 be used only for voter registration purposes; and The particular driver license office in which the 22 5. person applies to register to vote or updates a voter 23 24 registration record will remain confidential and may be used 25 only for voter registration purposes. (b) Require a driver's license examiner to inquire 26 orally, or inquire in writing if the applicant is hearing 27 28 impaired, and whether the applicant wishes to register to vote 29 or update a voter registration record during the completion of a driver's license or identification card application, 30 31 renewal, or change of address. 5

Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles in the course 4 5 of filling out the forms necessary under subsection (1) must б be transferred to a voter registration application; 7 The additional necessary information must be b. 8 obtained by the driver's license examiner and must not 9 duplicate any information already obtained while completing 10 the forms required under subsection (1); and 11 с. A voter registration application with all of the applicant's voter registration information must be presented 12 13 to the applicant to sign. If the applicant declines to register to vote, 14 2. update the applicant's voter registration record, or change 15 the applicant's address by either orally declining or by 16 17 failing to sign the voter registration application, the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles must keep the 18 19 declination for 2 years. The department shall forward any unsigned voter registration application to the appropriate 20 21 supervisor of elections within 5 days after receipt. 22 Section 3. Section 5. Subsection (1) of section 97.1031, Florida 20 21 Statutes, is amended to read: 97.1031 Notice of change of residence within the same 22 county, change of name, or change of party .--23 24 (1) When an elector moves from the address named on that person's voter registration record to another address 25 26 within the same county, the elector must notify provide a 27 signed, written notification of such move to the supervisor 28 and obtain a registration identification card reflecting the 29 new address of legal residence. Notification may be made by a 30 signed, written notice, or by telephonic or electronic means, 31 in which case the elector's birthdate must be included.

The notice must plainly state that the voter is potentially ineligible to be registered to vote 4 5 and must state a time and place for the person to appear to б show cause why his or her name should not be removed from the 7 voter registration rolls.After reviewing the information 8 requested by the supervisor of elections and provided by the 9 voter, if the supervisor of elections determines that the 10 voter is not eligible to vote under the laws of this state, 11 the supervisor of elections shall notify the voter by certified United States mail that he or she has been found 12 ineligible to register to vote in this state, shall state the 13 reason for the ineligibility, and shall inform the voter that 14 he or she has been will be removed from the voter registration 15 rolls. The supervisor shall remove from the voter registration 16 17 rolls the name of any voter who fails to respond within 30 days to the notice sent by certified mail or to attend the 18 19 hearing. 1. Upon hearing all evidence, the supervisor must 20 determine whether there is sufficient evidence to strike the 21 22 person's name from the registration books. If the supervisor determines that there is sufficient evidence, he or she must 23 24 strike the name. 25 2. Appeal may be taken to the circuit court in the county where the person was registered. Notice of appeal must 26 27 be filed within the time and in the manner provided by the 28 Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure and acts as supersedeas. 29 Trial in the circuit court is de novo and governed by the rules of that court. 19	signature, is maintained digitally or on electronic, magnetic,
20	or optic media, such stored information may be substituted for

The 8 9 precinct register may also contain a list of the forms of 10 identification, which must include, but is not limited to, a Florida driver's license, a Florida identification card issued 11 under s. 322.051, or another form of picture identification 12 approved by the Department of State. The precinct register 13 14 may also contain a space for the elector's signature, a space 15 for the initials of the witnessing clerk or inspector, and a 16 space for the signature slip or ballot number. 17 Section 12.
