Paragraphs (a) and (c) of subsection (1) 19 and subsections (4), (5), (6), (7), (8), and (9) of section 20 163.05, Florida Statutes, are amended to read: 21 163.05 Small County Technical Assistance Program. --22 (1) Among small counties, the Legislature finds that: The percentage of the population of small counties 23 (a) 24 residing in the unincorporated areas is relatively high based on the census of 2000 and increased substantially between 25 1980 and 1990. 26 27 (c) Fiscal shortfalls persist even though 1213 of the 28 small counties levied the maximum ad valorem millage 29 authorized in their jurisdictions in 20011990 and an 30 additional 15 13 small counties levied between 8 and 10 mills. 31 (4) The Commissioner of AgricultureComptroller shall 1 File original & 9 copies hag0009 02/12/02 08:10 pm 01343-aq -804865

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enter into contracts with program providers who shall: 1 2 (a) Be a non profit 501c(3) foundation with a 3 governing board having representation of county commissioners 4 and county professional staff. Be a public agency or private, 5 nonprofit corporation, association, or entity. (b) Have a substantial and documented experience б 7 working closely with all county governments in providing both 8 education and technical assistance. (c) (b) Use existing resources, services, and 9 10 information that are available from state or local agencies, 11 universities, or the private sector. 12 (d)(c) Seek and accept funding from any public or 13 private source. 14 (d) Annually submit information to assist the 15 Legislative Committee on Intergovernmental Relations in 16 preparing a performance review that will include an analysis 17 of the effectiveness of the program. (e) Assist small counties in developing alternative 18 revenue sources. 19 (f) Provide assistance to small counties in the areas 20 such as of financial management, accounting, investing, 21 22 purchasing, planning and budgeting, debt issuance, public management, management systems, computers and information 23 24 technology, economic and community development, and public 25 safety management. (g) Provide for an annual independent financial audit 26 27 of the program. In each county served, conduct a needs assessment 28 (h) upon which the assistance provided for that county will be 29 30 designed. 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shall issue a request for proposals to provide assistance to 1 2 small counties. The request for proposals shall be required no 3 more frequently than every third year beginning with fiscal 4 year 2004-2005. All contracts in existence on the effective 5 date of this legislation between the Comptroller and any other party with respect to the Small County Technical Assistance 6 7 Program may be accepted by the Commissioner of Agriculture as the party in interest and said contract(s) shall remain in 8 full force and effect according to its terms. At the request 9 10 of the Comptroller, the Legislative Committee on 11 Intergovernmental Relations shall assist in the preparation of 12 the request for proposals. 13 The Commissioner of Agriculture Comptroller shall (b) 14 review each contract proposal submitted. 15 (c) The Legislative Committee on Intergovernmental Relations shall review each contract proposal and submit to 16 17 the Comptroller, in writing, advisory comments and 18 recommendations, citing with specificity the reasons for its 19 recommendations. 20 (c)(d) The Commissioner of AgricultureComptroller and the council shall consider the following factors in reviewing 21 22 contract proposals: 23 1. The demonstrated capacity of the provider to 24 conduct needs assessments and implement the program as 25 proposed. 2. The number of small counties to be served under the 26 27 proposal. The cost of the program as specified in a proposed 28 3. 29 budget. 30 4. The short-term and long-term benefits of the 31 assistance to small counties. 3 File original & 9 copies hag0009

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The form and extent to which existing resources, 5. 1 2 services, and information that are available from state and 3 local agencies, universities, and the private sector will be 4 used by the provider under the contract. 5 (6) A decision of the Commissioner of 6 AgricultureComptroller to award a contract under this section 7 is final and shall be in writing with a copy provided to the 8 Legislative Committee on Intergovernmental Relations. 9 (7) The Comptroller may enter into contracts and 10 agreements with other state and local agencies and with any 11 person, association, corporation, or entity other than the 12 program providers, for the purpose of administering this 13 section. (7)<del>(8)</del> The Commissioner of Agriculture<del>Comptroller</del> 14 15 shall provide fiscal oversight to ensure that funds expended 16 for the program are used in accordance with the contracts 17 entered into pursuant to subsection (4) and shall conduct a 18 performance review of the program as may be necessary to 19 ensure that the goals and objectives of the program are being 20 met. 21 (9) The Legislative Committee on Intergovernmental 22 Relations shall annually conduct a performance review program. The findings of the review shall be presented in a 23 report submitted to the Governor, the President of the Senate, 24 25 the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the Comptroller by January 15 of each year. 26 27 Section 2.
