SENATE SUMMARY

Prohibits a person from using a cellular telephone while operating a motor vehicle within a school zone during the hours when the reduced speed limit is in effect unless the operator uses a hands-free device. Provides that a person who violates such prohibition commits a moving violation. Provides a fine of \$60. Requires that signs for a school zone designate the times during which the prohibition is in effect.
