## SENATE SUMMARY Revises the elements of the offense of robbery to provide that robbery is a first-degree felony, punishable by life imprisonment if, in the course of committing a robbery, the offender used a firearm or deadly weapon. Provides that robbery is a first-degree felony if the offender used a weapon. Provides that robbery is a second-degree felony if the offender did not use a firearm, deadly weapon, or other weapon.
