18 Section 1. Subsection (1) of section 40.011, Florida  
19 Statutes, is amended to read:

20 40.011 Jury lists.--

21 (1) The Department of Highway Safety and Motor  
22 Vehicles shall deliver monthly to the clerk of the circuit  
23 court in each county a list of names of persons who reside in  
24 that county, who are citizens of the United States, who are  
25 legal residents of Florida, who are 18 years of age or older,  
26 and for whom the department has a driver's license or  
27 identification card record.~~On or before January 1, 1993, and~~  
28 ~~each year thereafter by January 1, the Department of Highway~~  
29 ~~Safety and Motor Vehicles shall deliver to the clerk of the~~  
30 ~~circuit court in each county a list of names, along with~~  
31 ~~mailing addresses and dates of birth, of each person 18 years~~

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1 ~~of age or older whose name appears in the department database~~  
2 ~~and whose address is in that county. By January 1, 1992, the~~  
3 ~~department shall begin the process of identifying persons~~  
4 ~~whose names appear in the department database who are not~~  
5 ~~citizens of the United States and legal residents of this~~  
6 ~~state for the purpose of jury selection. By January 1, 1998,~~  
7 ~~the department database list delivered to the clerk of the~~  
8 ~~circuit court in each county may include only the names of~~  
9 ~~persons who are citizens of the United States and legal~~  
10 ~~residents of Florida and whose address is in that county and~~  
11 ~~who are 18 years of age or older. The clerk of the circuit~~  
12 ~~court shall add to the list the name of any person who is 18~~  
13 ~~years of age or older and who is a citizen of the United~~  
14 ~~States and a legal resident of Florida and who indicates a~~  
15 ~~desire to serve as a juror, but whose name does not appear on~~  
16 ~~the department database list, by requiring such person to~~  
17 ~~execute an affidavit at the office of the clerk.~~

18 Section 2. Section 40.022, Florida Statutes, is  
19 amended to read:

20 40.022 Clerk to purge jury selection lists;  
21 restoration.--

22 (1) Each clerk of the circuit court shall, upon  
23 receipt of the list of persons in the department database from  
24 the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles and at  
25 least once each month thereafter, purge the jury selection  
26 lists of the names of those persons:

- 27 (a) Adjudicated mentally incompetent;  
28 (b) Convicted of a felony; or  
29 (c) Deceased.

30 (2) The Department of Health shall furnish monthly to  
31 each clerk of the circuit court a list containing the name,

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1 address, age, race, and sex of each person 18 years of age or  
2 older and a resident of such clerk's county who died during  
3 the preceding calendar month.

4 (3) A person who has had his or her mental competency  
5 or civil rights restored and who wants to serve as a juror  
6 must execute the affidavit under oath as provided in s.  
7 40.011.

8 (4) The Florida Department of Law Enforcement shall  
9 establish procedures to enable the Clerk of the Court in each  
10 county to submit monthly the names and other identifying  
11 information about the persons selected for the jury list. The  
12 Department of Law Enforcement will search its databases and  
13 return an automated file of matching records that would assist  
14 the Clerk in evaluating whether a member of the jury pool  
15 should be disqualified under the provisions of s. 40.013(1).

16 Section 3. Subsection (1) of section 322.051, Florida  
17 Statutes, is amended to read:

18 322.051 Identification cards.--

19 (1) Any person who is 12 years of age or older, or any  
20 person who has a disability, regardless of age, who applies  
21 for a disabled parking permit under s. 320.0848, may be issued  
22 an identification card by the department upon completion of an  
23 application and payment of an application fee.

24 (a) Each such application shall include the following  
25 information regarding the applicant:

26 1. Full name (first, middle or maiden, and last),  
27 gender, social security card number, county of residence and  
28 mailing address, and a brief description.

29 2. Proof of birth date satisfactory to the department.

30 3. Proof of identity satisfactory to the department.

31 Such proof must include one of the following unless a driver's

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1 license record or identification card record has already been  
2 established: a certified copy of a United States birth  
3 certificate, a valid United States passport, an alien  
4 registration receipt card (green card), an employment  
5 authorization card issued by the United States Department of  
6 Justice, or proof of nonimmigrant classification provided by  
7 the United States Department of Justice, for an original  
8 identification card.

9 (b) An application for an identification card must be  
10 signed and verified by the applicant in a format designated by  
11 the department before a person authorized to administer oaths.  
12 The fee for an identification card is \$3, including payment  
13 for the color photograph or digital image of the applicant.

14 Section 4. Subsection (2) of section 322.08, Florida  
15 Statutes, is amended to read:

16 322.08 Application for license.--

17 (2) Each such application shall include the following  
18 information regarding the applicant:

19 (a) Full name (first, middle or maiden, and last),  
20 gender, social security card number, county of residence and  
21 mailing address, and a brief description.

22 (b) Proof of birth date satisfactory to the  
23 department.

24 (c) Proof of identity satisfactory to the department.  
25 Such proof must include one of the following unless a driver's  
26 license record or identification card record has already been  
27 established: a certified copy of a United States birth  
28 certificate, a valid United States passport, an alien  
29 registration receipt card (green card), an employment  
30 authorization card issued by the United States Department of  
31 Justice, or proof of nonimmigrant classification provided by

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1 the United States Department of Justice, for an original  
2 license.

3 (d) Whether the applicant has previously been licensed  
4 to drive, and, if so, when and by what state, and whether any  
5 such license or driving privilege has ever been disqualified,  
6 revoked, or suspended, or whether an application has ever been  
7 refused, and, if so, the date of and reason for such  
8 disqualification, suspension, revocation, or refusal.

9 Section 5. This act shall take effect October 1, 2002.
