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A bill to be entitled

An act relating to career criminals; defining the term "career criminal" for purposes of the act; requiring that an offender who is convicted as a habitual felony offender, a habitual violent felony offender, a violent career criminal, a three-time violent felony offender, or a prison releasee reoffender register with the sheriff of the county in which the offender resides; specifying the information to be provided to the sheriff; providing for the registration of a career criminal who is in the custody or control of, or under the supervision of, the Department of Corrections; providing for the registration of a career criminal who is in the custody of a local jail; requiring that a career criminal register within a specified period with the sheriff following the establishment of permanent or temporary residence in the state; requiring that the career criminal also register in person at a driver's license office of the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles; requiring the sheriff to notify the state attorney of the county and the police chief of the municipality where the career criminal maintains a residence; requiring that the career criminal notify the sheriff before he or she establishes residence in another state; providing a penalty for providing false location information; requiring that the

sheriff maintain information concerning career criminals; providing that information concerning career criminals is a public record; authorizing the sheriff to disseminate such information; providing a penalty for failure to register as required, maintain such registration, provide location information, or comply with certain requirements; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Registration of career criminals; penalty.--

- (1) As used in this section, the term "career criminal" means any offender who is convicted as a habitual felony offender, a habitual violent felony offender, a violent career criminal, a three-time violent felony offender under s. 775.084, Florida Statutes, or a prison releasee reoffender under s. 775.082(9), Florida Statutes.
- (2) This section does not apply to any person who has been designated as a sexual predator under s. 775.21, Florida Statutes, or who is required to register as a sexual offender under s. 943.0435 or s. 944.607, Florida Statutes.
- (3) Each career criminal in this state shall register with the sheriff of the county in which the career criminal resides by providing the following information to the sheriff:
- (a) Name, social security number, age, race, sex, date of birth, height, weight, hair and eye color, photograph, address of legal residence and address of any current temporary residence, within the state or out of state,

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including a rural route address or a post office box, date and
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   place of any employment, date and place of each conviction,
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   fingerprints, and a brief description of the crime or crimes
   committed by the offender. A post office box may not be
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   provided in lieu of a physical residential address. If the
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   place of residence of the career criminal is a motor vehicle,
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   trailer, mobile home, or manufactured home, as defined in
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   chapter 320, Florida Statutes, the career criminal shall also
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   provide to the sheriff written notice of: the vehicle
   identification number; the license tag number; the
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   registration number; and a description, including color
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   scheme, of the motor vehicle, trailer, mobile home, or
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   manufactured home. If a career criminal's place of residence
   is a vessel, live-aboard vessel, or houseboat, as defined in
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   chapter 327, Florida Statutes, the career criminal shall also
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   provide to the sheriff written notice of: the hull
   identification number; the manufacturer's serial number; the
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   name of the vessel, live-aboard vessel, or houseboat; the
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   registration number; and a description, including color
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   scheme, of the vessel, live-aboard vessel, or houseboat.
          (b) Any other information determined necessary by the
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   sheriff, including criminal and corrections records,
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   nonprivileged personnel records, and evidentiary genetic
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   markers when available.
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          (4) If the career criminal is in the custody or
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   control of, or under the supervision of, the Department of
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   Corrections, or is in the custody of a private correctional
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   facility, the career criminal shall register with the sheriff
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   of the county in which the facility is located. The Department
   of Corrections shall provide to the sheriff registration
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   information and the location of, and local telephone number
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 for, any office of the Department of Corrections which is responsible for supervising the career criminal. In addition, the Department of Corrections shall notify the sheriff if the career criminal escapes or absconds from custody or supervision or if the career criminal dies.

- (5) If the career criminal is in the custody of a local jail, the custodian of the local jail shall register the career criminal and forward the registration information to the sheriff. The custodian of the local jail shall also take a digitized photograph of the career criminal while the career criminal remains in custody and shall provide the digitized photograph to the sheriff. The custodian shall notify the sheriff if the career criminal escapes from custody or dies.
- (6) If the career criminal is under federal supervision, the federal agency responsible for supervising the career criminal may forward to the sheriff any information regarding the career criminal which is consistent with the information provided by the Department of Corrections under this section, and may indicate whether use of the information is restricted to law enforcement purposes only or may be used by the sheriff for purposes of public notification.
- (7) If the career criminal is not in the custody or control of, or under the supervision of, the Department of Corrections, or is not in the custody of a private correctional facility, and establishes or maintains a residence in this state, the career criminal shall register in person at the sheriff's office in the county in which the career criminal establishes or maintains a residence, within 48 hours after establishing permanent or temporary residence in this state. If a career criminal registers with the

sheriff's office, the sheriff shall take a photograph and a 1 2 set of fingerprints of the career criminal. 3 (8) Within 48 hours after the registration required under subsection (3) or subsection (7), a career criminal who 4 5 is not incarcerated and who resides in the community, 6 including a career criminal under the supervision of the 7 Department of Corrections, shall register in person at a 8 driver's license office of the Department of Highway Safety 9 and Motor Vehicles and shall present proof of registration. At the driver's license office the career criminal shall: 10 11 (a) If otherwise qualified, secure a Florida driver's 12 license, renew a Florida driver's license, or secure an 13 identification card. The career criminal shall identify 14 himself or herself as a career criminal who is required to comply with this section, provide the address of his or her 15 16 place of permanent or temporary residence, including a rural route address or a post office box, and submit to the taking 17 of a photograph for use in issuing a driver's license, renewed 18 19 license, or identification card and for use by the sheriff in 20 maintaining current records of the career criminal. A post office box may not be provided in lieu of a physical 21 residential address. If the career criminal's place of 22 residence is a motor vehicle, trailer, mobile home, or 23 manufactured home, as defined in chapter 320, Florida 24 25 Statutes, the career criminal shall also provide to the 26 Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles the vehicle 27 identification number, the license tag number, the 28 registration number, and a description, including color scheme, of the motor vehicle, trailer, mobile home, or 29 manufactured home. If a career criminal's place of residence 30 is a vessel, live-aboard vessel, or houseboat, as defined in

chapter 327, Florida Statutes, the career criminal shall also provide to the Department of Highway Safety and Motor

Vehicles: the hull identification number; the manufacturer's serial number; the name of the vessel, live-aboard vessel, or houseboat; the registration number; and a description, including color scheme, of the vessel, live-aboard vessel, or houseboat.

- (b) Pay the costs assessed by the Department of
 Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles for issuing or renewing a
 driver's license or identification card as required by this
 section.
- (c) Provide, upon request, any additional information necessary to confirm the identity of the career criminal, including a set of fingerprints.
- identification card is subject to renewal, and within 48 hours after any change of the career criminal's residence or change in the career criminal's name by reason of marriage or other legal process, the career criminal shall report in person to a driver's license office and is subject to the requirements specified in subsection (8). The Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles shall forward to the sheriff and to the Department of Corrections all photographs and information provided by career criminals. Notwithstanding the restrictions set forth in s. 322.142, Florida Statutes, the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles may release a reproduction of a color photographic or digital imaged license to the sheriff for purposes of public notification concerning career criminals.
- (10) If a career criminal registers with the sheriff, the sheriff shall, within 48 hours, notify the state attorney

of the county and, if applicable, the police chief of the 1 2 municipality where the career criminal maintains a residence. (11) A career criminal who intends to establish 3 4 residence in another state or jurisdiction shall report in 5 person to the sheriff of the county of current residence 6 within 48 hours before the date he or she intends to leave 7 this state to establish residence in another state or 8 jurisdiction. The career criminal shall provide to the sheriff 9 the address, municipality, county, and state of intended residence. The sheriff shall notify the statewide law 10 11 enforcement agency, or a comparable agency, in the intended 12 state or jurisdiction of residence of the career criminal's 13 intended residence. The failure of a career criminal to 14 provide his or her intended place of residence is punishable as provided in subsection (14). 15 (12) A career criminal who indicates his or her intent 16 to reside in another state or jurisdiction and later decides 17 to remain in this state shall, within 48 hours after the date 18 19 upon which the career criminal indicated he or she would leave 20 this state, report in person to the sheriff of the county of current residence his or her intent to remain in this state. A 21 22 career criminal who reports his or her intent to reside in another state or jurisdiction, but who remains in this state 23 without reporting to the sheriff in the manner required by 24 this subsection, commits a felony of the second degree, 25 26 punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 27 775.084, Florida Statutes. 28 (13) The sheriff's registration list of career criminals is a public record. The sheriff may disseminate this 29 public information by any means considered appropriate, 30 including operating a toll-free telephone number for this

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registered career criminal to the public, the sheriff shall 2 3 advise the person making the inquiry that positive 4 identification of a person believed to be a career criminal 5 cannot be established unless a fingerprint comparison is made. (14) Except as otherwise specifically provided in this 6 7 section, a career criminal who fails to register; fails, after 8 registration, to maintain, acquire, or renew a driver's 9 license or identification card; fails to provide required 10 location information or change-of-name information; or 11 otherwise fails, by act or omission, to comply with the 12 requirements of this section commits a felony of the third 13 degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084, Florida Statutes. 14 15 Section 2. This act shall take effect October 1, 2002. 16 17 18 HOUSE SUMMARY Provides that an offender convicted as a habitual felony offender, a habitual violent felony offender, a violent career criminal, a three-time violent felony offender, or a prison releasee reoffender is a career criminal, and requires such offender to register with the sheriff of the county in which the offender resides. Requires each local sheriff to provide for the registration of career criminals who are in the custody or control of, or under the supervision of, the Department of Corrections. Requires that a career criminal also register in person at a driver's license office of the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles. Requires the sheriff to notify the state attorney of the county and the police chief of the municipality where the career criminal maintains a residence. purpose. When the sheriff provides information regarding a

information concerning a career criminal is a public record and authorizes the sheriff to disseminate such information. Provides a third degree felony penalty for
