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17	Section 1. Section 627.3111, Florida Statutes, is

necessary for the receiving entity to perform its duties and responsibilities, and may be disclosed to the National 2 3 Association of Insurance Commissioners. The receiving governmental entity and the association must maintain the 4 5 confidential and exempt status of such information and records. The information and records made confidential and 6 exempt by this section may be used in a criminal, civil, or 7 8 administrative proceeding so long as the confidential and exempt status of the information and records is maintained. 9 This section is subject to the Open Government Sunset Review 10 11 Act of 1995 in accordance with s. 119.15 and shall stand repealed on October 2, 2007, unless reviewed and saved from 12 repeal through reenactment by the Legislature. 13 Section 2. The Legislature finds that the public 14 records exemption created by this act is a public necessity in 15 order to protect an individual's sensitive, personal 16 information. Disclosure of bank account numbers and debit, 17 charge, and credit card numbers would create the opportunity 18 19 for theft or fraud, thereby jeopardizing the financial security of an individual. Limiting the disclosure of 20 personal identifying information contained in records that 21 disclose personal financial information held by the Department 22 of Insurance or its service providers is also necessary in 23 24 order to protect the financial interests of those persons to whom that information pertains. Such numbers and information 25 could be used for fraudulent and other illegal purposes, 26 27 including identity theft, and could result in substantial financial harm. Furthermore, every person has an expectation 28 29 of and a right to privacy in all matters concerning his or her personal financial matters. The Legislature further finds 30 that it is a public necessity that medical records and 31

personal identifying information contained in records that disclose personal health information be made confidential and exempt because matters of personal health are traditionally private and confidential concerns between the patient and the health care provider. The private and confidential nature of personal health matters pervades both the public and private health care sectors. Moreover, public disclosure of medical information could have a negative effect upon a person's business and personal relationships, and could also have detrimental financial consequences. Section 3. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law. STATEMENT OF SUBSTANTIAL CHANGES CONTAINED IN COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR Senate Bill 1480 Specifies that a public records exemption would be created for personal identifying information, other than the name and address, contained in records that disclose personal financial or health information held by the Department of Insurance.
