893. The law enforcement officer may use reasonable force if necessary to require such person to submit to the administration of the blood test. The blood test shall be performed in a reasonable manner. The term "serious bodily injury" means an injury to any person, including the driver, which consists of a physical condition that creates a substantial risk of death, serious personal disfigurement, or protracted loss or impairment of the function of any bodily member or organ. Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2002. SENATE SUMMARY Provides that, when a law enforcement officer has probable cause to believe that the operator of a motor vehicle that is involved in a traffic accident that results in death or serious bodily injury is under the influence of alcohol or chemical or controlled substances, a test of the operator's blood must be performed.
