304-2193-02 A bill to be entitled 1 2 An act relating to immunizations; creating s. 3 381.0421, F.S.; requiring that individuals enrolled in a postsecondary educational 4 5 institution be provided information regarding б meningococcal meningitis and hepatitis B 7 vaccines and, if residing in on-campus housing, 8 provide documentation of vaccination against 9 meningococcal meningitis and hepatitis B, or a statement declining such vaccination; providing 10 11 an effective date. 12 13 WHEREAS, meningococcal meningitis is a serious disease 14 that can lead to death within a few hours of onset, and 15 WHEREAS, meningococcal meningitis is a highly 16 contagious but largely preventable infection of the 17 spinal-cord fluid and the fluid that surrounds the brain, and 18 WHEREAS, one in ten cases of meningococcal meningitis 19 is fatal, and 20 WHEREAS, one in seven survivors is left with a severe handicap, such as loss of a limb, mental retardation, 21 paralysis, deafness, or seizures, and 22 23 WHEREAS, individuals of any age can carry the disease for days, weeks, or months unknowingly or without becoming 24 ill, and 25 26 WHEREAS, at any time, from 10 to 25 percent of the 27 population carries meningococcal meningitis, and 28 WHEREAS, scientific evidence suggests that college 29 students living in dormitory facilities are six times more likely than other individuals to contract meningococcal 30 31 meningitis, and 1

1 WHEREAS, immunization against meningococcal meningitis 2 will decrease the risk of disease, and 3 WHEREAS, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention 4 recommends that college students be vaccinated against this 5 disease, and б WHEREAS, the Legislature urges that college freshmen 7 residing in on-campus housing be vaccinated against 8 meningococcal meningitis, NOW, THEREFORE, 9 10 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 11 Section 1. Section 381.0421, Florida Statutes, is 12 13 created to read: 14 381.0421 Vaccination against meningococcal meningitis 15 and hepatitis B.--(1) A postsecondary educational institution shall 16 17 provide detailed information concerning the risks associated with meningococcal meningitis and hepatitis B and the 18 19 availability, effectiveness, and known contraindications of 20 any required or recommended vaccine to every student, or to the student's parent or guardian if the student is a minor, 21 22 who has been accepted for admission. (2) An individual enrolled in a postsecondary 23 24 educational institution who will be residing in on-campus 25 housing shall provide documentation of vaccinations against meningococcal meningitis and hepatitis B unless the 26 27 individual, if the individual is 18 years of age or older, or 28 the individual's parent or guardian, if the individual is a 29 minor, declines the vaccinations by signing a separate waiver for each of these vaccines, provided by the institution, 30 31 acknowledging receipt and review of the information provided. 2

(3) This section does not require any postsecondary educational institution to provide or pay for vaccinations against meningococcal meningitis and hepatitis B. Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2002. STATEMENT OF SUBSTANTIAL CHANGES CONTAINED IN COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR б CS for SB 1628 -Includes legislative intent language relating to the recommendations of the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention for immunizations of college students; -Removes requirements related to diphtheria and tetanus; -Requires separate waivers to be signed for each of the vaccines when a student wishes to decline an immunization; and -Makes a technical correction to the name of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.
