A bill to be entitled

An act relating to sexual offenses; amending s. 825.1025, F.S.; providing for the crime of lewd or lascivious offenses committed upon or in the presence of an elderly person or disabled person; providing penalties; amending s. 921.0022, F.S., relating to the offense severity ranking chart of the criminal punishment code; revising punishment for lewd or lascivious battery upon an elderly person or disabled adult; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 825.1025, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

 $825.1025\,$ Lewd or lascivious offenses committed upon or in the presence of an elderly person or disabled $\underline{\text{person}}$ adult.--

- (1) As used in this section, "sexual activity" means the oral, anal, or vaginal penetration by, or union with, the sexual organ of another or the anal or vaginal penetration of another by any other object; however, sexual activity does not include an act done for a bona fide medical purpose.
- (2)(a) "Lewd or lascivious battery upon an elderly person or disabled <u>person</u> adult" occurs when a person encourages, forces, or entices an elderly person or disabled <u>person</u> adult to engage in sadomasochistic abuse, sexual bestiality, prostitution, or any other act involving sexual activity, when the person knows or reasonably should know that

the elderly person or disabled <u>person</u> adult either lacks the capacity to consent or fails to give consent.

- (b) A person who commits lewd or lascivious battery upon an elderly person or disabled <u>person</u> adult commits a felony of the second degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084.
- (3)(a) "Lewd or lascivious molestation of an elderly person or disabled <u>person</u> adult" occurs when a person intentionally touches in a lewd or lascivious manner the breasts, genitals, genital area, or buttocks, or the clothing covering them, of an elderly person or disabled <u>person</u> adult when the person knows or reasonably should know that the elderly person or disabled <u>person</u> adult either lacks the capacity to consent or fails to give consent.
- (b) A person who commits lewd or lascivious molestation of an elderly person or disabled <u>person</u> adult commits a felony of the third degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084.
- (4)(a) "Lewd or lascivious exhibition in the presence of an elderly person or disabled <u>person</u> adult" occurs when a person, in the presence of an elderly person or disabled person adult:
 - 1. Intentionally masturbates;
- 2. Intentionally exposes his or her genitals in a lewd or lascivious manner; or
- 3. Intentionally commits any other lewd or lascivious act that does not involve actual physical or sexual contact with the elderly person or disabled person adult, including but not limited to, sadomasochistic abuse, sexual bestiality, or the simulation of any act involving sexual activity,

when the person knows or reasonably should know that the 2 elderly person or disabled person adult either lacks the 3 capacity to consent or fails to give consent to having such 4 act committed in his or her presence. 5 (b) A person who commits a lewd or lascivious 6 exhibition in the presence of an elderly person or disabled 7 person adult commits a felony of the third degree, punishable 8 as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084. 9 Section 2.
