The purpose of the advisory board is to serve as a 15 resource for the department and to provide the Governor, the 16 17 Legislature, and the Secretary of Community Affairs with 18 private sector and other public agency perspectives on 19 achieving the goal of increasing the use of alternative fuel vehicles in this state. 20 Members shall be appointed to serve terms of 1 year 21 22 each, with reappointment at the discretion of the Secretary of Community Affairs. Vacancies shall be filled for the remainder 23 24 of the unexpired term in the same manner as the original 25 appointment. 4. The board shall annually select a chairperson. 26 27 5.a. - b. Meetings are exempt from the notice requirements of chapter 120, and sufficient notice shall be given to afford interested persons reasonable notice under the circumstances.
- 6. Members of the board are entitled to travel expenses while engaged in the performance of board duties.
- 7. The board shall terminate on July 1, 2004 5 years after the effective date of this act.
- (c) The board shall review the performance of the state with reference to alternative fuel vehicle implementation in complying with federal laws and maximizing available federal funding and may:
- 1. Advise the Governor, Legislature, and the Secretary of Community Affairs and make recommendations regarding implementation and use of alternative fuel vehicles in this state.
- 2. Identify potential improvements in this act and the state's alternative fuel policies.
- 3. Request from all state agencies any information the board determines relevant to board duties.
- 4. Regularly report to the Secretary of Community Affairs, the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives regarding the board's findings and recommendations.
- (d)1. The advisory board shall, <u>by January 1, 2003</u> within 120 days after its first meeting, make recommendations to the Department of Community Affairs, the Governor, and the Legislature regarding:
- 1. The impact of emerging transportation technologies, including, but not limited to, hybrid vehicles, fuel cells, and hydrogen fuels, on state transportation revenues derived

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from motor fuel taxes as a result of improved fuel efficiencies and increased use of alternative fuels.

- 2. The impact of emerging transportation technologies on transportation infrastructure such as, but not limited to, fuel distribution, refueling infrastructure, and technology and training needs, especially with regard to the pending impact of fuel cell technology on transportation and energy.
- 3. The development of emerging transportation technologies and their potential for impact on this state's investment in transportation.
- 4. The projected costs of an alternative fuel vehicle incentive program. for establishing pilot programs in this state that provide experience and support the best use expansion of the alternative fuel vehicle industry in this state. No funds shall be released for a project unless there is at least a 50-percent private or local match.
- 2. In addition to the pilot programs, the advisory board shall assess federal, state, and local initiatives to identify incentives that encourage successful alternative fuel vehicle programs; obstacles to alternative fuel vehicle use including legislative, regulatory, and economic obstacles; and programs that educate and inform the public about alternative fuel vehicles.
- 3. The advisory board is charged with determining a reasonable, fair, and equitable way to address current motor fuel taxes as they apply to alternative fuels and at what threshold of market penetration.
- 4. Based on its findings, the advisory board shall develop recommendations to the Legislature on future alternative fuel vehicle programs and legislative changes that 31 provide the best use of state and other resources to enhance

the alternative fuel vehicle market in this state and maximize 2 the return on that investment in terms of job creation, 3 economic development, and emissions reduction. (e) The advisory board, working with the Department of 4 5 Community Affairs, shall develop a budget for the department's 6 approval, and all expenditures shall be approved by the 7 department. At the conclusion of the first year, the department shall conduct an audit of the board and board programs. 9 10 Section 2. The sum of \$50,000 is appropriated to the 11 Center for Urban Transportation Research for the purpose of assisting the Clean Fuel Florida Advisory Board in the 12 preparation of the report provided in section 403.42(3)(d), 13 14 Florida Statutes. The Department of Transportation shall assist the advisory board by sharing any relevant studies to 15 prevent the duplication of effort. 16 17 Section 3.
