# I. <u>SU</u>MMARY:

This legislation re-creates the Federal Law Enforcement Trust Fund, FLAIR number 55-2-719, without modification. The Federal Law Enforcement Trust Fund is administered by the Department of Transportation.

# II. SUBSTANTIVE ANALYSIS:

# A. PRESENT SITUATION:

# 1. MAJOR STATUTES THAT CONTROL THE TRUST FUND:

Section 339.082, F.S., creates the Federal Law Enforcement Trust Fund and provides for its purposes.

# 2. BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF THE FUND'S USES OR PURPOSES:

The receipts of the Federal Law Enforcement Trust Fund are expended receive receipts and revenues as a result of federal criminal, administrative, or civil forfeiture proceedings and federal asset sharing programs.

# 3. MAJOR SOURCES OF REVENUE FOR THE FUND:

Total receipts for the 2000-2001 fiscal year were \$426,648. Agency estimates for the 2001-2002 fiscal year and the 2002-2003 fiscal year are both \$450,000.

Sources of receipts for the Federal Law Enforcement Trust Fund are federal sharing checks and interest earnings on savings. Total receipts from federal sharing checks in the 2000-2001 fiscal year were \$371,224. Agency estimates for receipts from federal sharing checks for the 2001-2002 fiscal year and the 2002-2003 fiscal year are both \$400,000. Total receipts from interest in the 2000-2001 fiscal year were \$55,424. Agency estimates for receipts from interest in the 2001-2002 fiscal year and the 2002-2003 fiscal year are both \$50,000.
