A bill to be entitled 1 2 An act relating to the lottery; amending ss. 24.105 and 24.111, F.S.; deleting provisions 3 4 for the sale of lottery tickets through player-activated vending machines; repealing s. 5 24.1055, F.S., relating to sale of lottery 6 7 tickets to minors and posting of signs; 8 providing an effective date. 9 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 10 11 12 Section 1. Paragraph (a) of subsection (9) of section 24.105, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 13 14 24.105 Powers and duties of department.--The 15 department shall: (9) Adopt rules governing the establishment and 16 17 operation of the state lottery, including: 18 The type of lottery games to be conducted, except (a) 19 that: No name of an elected official shall appear on the 20 1. ticket or play slip of any lottery game or on any prize or on 21 2.2 any instrument used for the payment of prizes, unless such 23 prize is in the form of a state warrant. 24 2. No coins or currency shall be dispensed from any 25 electronic computer terminal or device used in any lottery 26 game. 27 3. Other than as provided in subparagraph 4., No terminal or device may be used for any lottery game which may 28 29 be operated solely by the player without the assistance of the 30 retailer. 31 1

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4. The only player-activated machine which may be 1 2 utilized is a machine which dispenses instant lottery game 3 tickets following the insertion of a coin or currency by a ticket purchaser. To be authorized a machine must: be under 4 5 the supervision and within the direct line of sight of the lottery retailer to ensure that the machine is monitored and 6 7 only operated by persons at least 18 years of age; be capable 8 of being electronically deactivated by the retailer to 9 prohibit use by persons less than 18 years of age through the use of a lockout device that maintains the machine's 10 deactivation for a period of no less than 5 minutes; and be 11 12 designed to prevent its use or conversion for use in any 13 manner other than the dispensing of instant lottery tickets. 14 Authorized machines may dispense change to players purchasing tickets but may not be utilized for paying the holders of 15 winning tickets of any kind. At least one clerk must be on 16 duty at the lottery retailer while the machine is in 17 18 operation. However, at least two clerks must be on duty at any lottery location which has violated s. 24.1055. 19 20 Section 2. Paragraphs (h) and (i) of subsection (2) of section 24.111, Florida Statutes, are amended to read: 21 24.111 Vendors; disclosure and contract 22 23 requirements.--24 (2) The department shall investigate the financial 25 responsibility, security, and integrity of each vendor with 26 which it intends to negotiate a contract for major 27 procurement. Such investigation may include an investigation 28 of the financial responsibility, security, and integrity of 29 any or all persons whose names and addresses are required to be disclosed pursuant to paragraph (a). Any person who submits 30 31 a bid, proposal, or offer as part of a major procurement must, 2

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1 at the time of submitting such bid, proposal, or offer, 2 provide the following: 3 (h) The department shall lease all instant ticket 4 vending machines. 5 (h)(i) The department will require a performance bond 6 for the duration of the contract. 7 8 The department shall not contract with any vendor who fails to 9 make the disclosures required by this subsection, and any contract with a vendor who has failed to make the required 10 11 disclosures shall be unenforceable. Any contract with any vendor who does not comply with such requirements for 12 13 periodically updating such disclosures during the tenure of 14 such contract as may be specified in such contract may be terminated by the department. This subsection shall be 15 16 construed broadly and liberally to achieve the ends of full disclosure of all information necessary to allow for a full 17 18 and complete evaluation by the department of the competence, 19 integrity, background, and character of vendors for major 20 procurements. 21 Section 3. Section 24.1055, Florida Statutes, is 22 repealed. 23 Section 4. This act shall take effect upon becoming a 24 law. 25 26 27 HOUSE SUMMARY 28 Removes provisions that allow the use of player-activated machines which dispense lottery tickets and requirements for such machines.
