A bill to be entitled

An act relating to school emergency
preparedness; amending s. 230.23, F.S.;
requiring the Department of Education to adopt
rules governing emergency drills which must be
followed by each district school board;
providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Paragraph (f) of subsection (6) of section 230.23, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

230.23 Powers and duties of school board.--The school board, acting as a board, shall exercise all powers and perform all duties listed below:

- (6) CHILD WELFARE.--Provide for the proper accounting for all children of school age, for the attendance and control of pupils at school, and for proper attention to health, safety, and other matters relating to the welfare of children in the following fields, as prescribed in chapter 232.
  - (f) Emergency drills; emergency procedures.--
- 1. The district school board shall formulate and prescribe policies and procedures for emergency drills and for actual emergencies, including, but not limited to, fires, natural disasters, and bomb threats, for all the public schools of the district which comprise grades K-12. District policies shall include commonly used alarm system responses for specific types of emergencies and verification by each school that drills have been provided as required by law and fire protection codes.

1	2. The district school board shall establish model
2	emergency management and emergency preparedness procedures for
3	the following life-threatening emergencies:
4	a. Weapon-use and hostage situations.
5	b. Hazardous materials or toxic chemical spills.
6	c. Weather emergencies, including hurricanes,
7	tornadoes, and severe storms.
8	d. Exposure as a result of a manmade emergency.
9	3. The Department of Education shall adopt rules
10	governing emergency drills which must be followed by each
11	district school board. The rules must require each school to
12	conduct and document at least 10 fire drills per school year
13	and at least 2 tornado drills per school year.
14	Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2002.
