A bill to be entitled 1 2 An act relating to Alzheimer's disease research; establishing the Florida Alzheimer's 3 4 Center and Research Institute at the University of South Florida; requiring the State Board of 5 Education to enter into an agreement with a 6 7 not-for-profit corporation for the governance 8 and operation of the institute; providing that 9 the corporation shall act as an instrumentality of the state; authorizing the creation of 10 subsidiaries by the corporation; providing 11 powers of the corporation; providing for a 12 board of directors of the corporation and the 13 appointment and terms of its membership; 14 authorizing the State Board of Education to 15 secure and provide liability protection; 16 providing for an annual audit and report; 17 providing for assumption of certain 18 19 responsibilities of the corporation by the State Board of Education under certain 20 circumstances; providing for administration of 21 2.2 the institute; providing for dispersal and use 23 of income; providing for reporting of 24 activities; requiring the appointment of a council of scientific advisers; providing 25 responsibilities and terms of the council; 26 27 providing that the corporation and its subsidiaries are not agencies within the 28 29 meaning of s. 20.03(11), F.S.; providing 30 appropriations; providing an effective date. 31

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 1 2 3 Section 1. Florida Alzheimer's Center and Research 4 Institute.--5 (1) There is established the Florida Alzheimer's 6 Center and Research Institute at the University of South 7 Florida. 8 (2)(a) The State Board of Education shall enter into 9 an agreement for the utilization of the facilities on the campus of the University of South Florida to be known as the 10 11 Florida Alzheimer's Center and Research Institute, including 12 all furnishings, equipment, and other chattels used in the 13 operation of said facilities, with a Florida not-for-profit 14 corporation organized solely for the purpose of governing and operating the Florida Alzheimer's Center and Research 15 Institute. This not-for-profit corporation, acting as an 16 instrumentality of the state, shall govern and operate the 17 Florida Alzheimer's Center and Research Institute in 18 19 accordance with the terms of the agreement between the State 20 Board of Education and the not-for-profit corporation. The not-for-profit corporation may, with the prior approval of the 21 State Board of Education, create not-for-profit corporate 22 subsidiaries to fulfill its mission. The not-for-profit 23 corporation and its subsidiaries are authorized to receive, 24 25 hold, invest, and administer property and any moneys received 26 from private, local, state, and federal sources, as well as 27 technical and professional income generated or derived from 28 practice activities of the institute, for the benefit of the 29 institute and the fulfillment of its mission. (b)1. The affairs of the not-for-profit corporation 30 shall be managed by a board of directors who shall serve

without compensation. The board of directors shall consist of the President of the University of South Florida and the chair of the State Board of Education, or their designees, five representatives of the state universities, and no fewer than nine nor more than 14 representatives of the public who are neither medical doctors nor state employees. Each director who is a representative of a state university or of the public shall serve a term of 3 years. The chair of the board of directors shall be selected by a majority vote of the directors. Each director shall have only one vote.

2. The initial board of directors shall consist of the President of the University of South Florida and the chair of the State Board of Education, or their designees; the five university representatives, of whom one shall be appointed by the Governor, two by the President of the Senate, and two by the Speaker of the House of Representatives; and nine public representatives, of whom three shall be appointed by the Governor, three by the President of the Senate, and three by the Speaker of the House of Representatives. Upon the expiration of the terms of the initial appointed directors, all directors subject to 3-year terms of office under this paragraph shall be elected by a majority vote of the directors and the board may be expanded to include additional public representative directors up to the maximum number allowed. Any vacancy in office shall be filled for the remainder of the term by majority vote of the directors. Any director may be reelected.

(3) The State Board of Education shall provide in the agreement with the not-for-profit corporation for the following:

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- (a) Approval by the State Board of Education of the articles of incorporation of the not-for-profit corporation.
- (b) Approval by the State Board of Education of the articles of incorporation of any not-for-profit corporate subsidiary created by the not-for-profit corporation.
- (c) Utilization of hospital facilities and personnel by the not-for-profit corporation and its subsidiaries for mutually approved teaching and research programs conducted by the University of South Florida or other accredited medical schools or research institutes.
- (d) Preparation of an annual postaudit of the not-for-profit corporation's financial accounts and the financial accounts of any subsidiaries to be conducted by an independent certified public accountant. The annual audit report shall include management letters and shall be submitted to the Auditor General and the State Board of Education for review. The State Board of Education, the Auditor General, and the Office of Program Policy Analysis and Government Accountability shall have the authority to require and receive from the not-for-profit corporation and any subsidiaries or from their independent auditor any detail or supplemental data relative to the operation of the not-for-profit corporation or subsidiary.
- (e) Provision by the not-for-profit corporation and its subsidiaries of equal employment opportunities to all persons regardless of race, color, religion, sex, age, or national origin.
- (4) The State Board of Education is authorized to secure comprehensive general liability protection, including professional liability protection, for the not-for-profit

corporation and its subsidiaries, pursuant to s. 240.213, Florida Statutes.

- (5) In the event that the agreement between the not-for-profit corporation and the State Board of Education is terminated for any reason, the State Board of Education shall assume governance and operation of the facilities.
- (6) The institute shall be administered by a chief executive officer who shall be appointed by and serve at the pleasure of the board of directors of the not-for-profit corporation and who shall have the following powers and duties, subject to the approval of the board of directors:
- (a) The chief executive officer shall establish programs that fulfill the mission of the institute in research, education, treatment, prevention, and early detection of Alzheimer's disease; however, the chief executive officer may not establish academic programs for which academic credit is awarded and which terminate in the conferring of a degree, without prior approval of the State Board of Education.
- (b) The chief executive officer shall have control over the budget and the dollars appropriated or donated to the institute from private, local, state, and federal sources, as well as technical and professional income generated or derived from practice activities of the institute. However, professional income generated by university faculty from practice activities at the institute shall be shared between the institute and the university as determined by the chief executive officer and the appropriate university dean or vice president.
- 30 <u>(c) The chief executive officer shall appoint members</u>
  31 to carry out the research, patient care, and educational

activities of the institute and determine compensation,
benefits, and terms of service. Members of the institute
shall be eligible to hold concurrent appointments at
affiliated academic institutions. University faculty shall be
eligible to hold concurrent appointments at the institute.

- (d) The chief executive officer shall have control over the use and assignment of space and equipment within the facilities.
- (e) The chief executive officer shall have the power to create the administrative structure necessary to carry out the mission of the institute.
- (f) The chief executive officer shall have a reporting relationship to the Commissioner of Education.
- (g) The chief executive officer shall provide a copy of the institute's annual report to the Governor and Cabinet, the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the chair of the State Board of Education.
- (7) The board of directors of the not-for-profit corporation shall create a council of scientific advisers to the chief executive officer comprised of leading researchers, physicians, and scientists. The council shall review programs and recommend research priorities and initiatives to maximize the state's investment in the institute. The members of the council shall be appointed by the board of directors of the not-for-profit corporation, except for five members appointed by the State Board of Education. Each member of the council shall be appointed to serve a 2-year term and may be reappointed to the council.

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In carrying out the provisions of this section, 1 2 the not-for-profit corporation and its subsidiaries are not agencies within the meaning of s. 20.03(11), Florida Statutes. 3 Section 2. The sum of \$20 million is appropriated for 4 5 fiscal year 2002-2003 from the Public Education Capital Outlay and Debt Service Trust Fund to the University of South Florida 6 7 for partial construction of a \$40 million research facility at 8 the university for the Florida Alzheimer's Center and Research 9 Institute. The sum of \$20 million is appropriated for 10 Section 3. 11 fiscal year 2002-2003 from the General Revenue Fund to the 12 University of South Florida for the operations of the Florida 13 Alzheimer's Center and Research Institute. From this amount \$15 million shall be used by the institute to contract with 14 the following entities, at \$5 million each, to support the 15 16 purposes of this act: the Mayo Clinic in Jacksonville, 17 Florida; the University of Florida; and the University of Miami. 18 19 Section 4.
