Paragraph (f) is added to subsection (15) of section 121.021, Florida Statutes, to read: 17 18 121.021 Definitions.--The following words and phrases 19 as used in this chapter have the respective meanings set forth 20 unless a different meaning is plainly required by the context: (15)21 22 (f) Effective July 1, 2002, "special risk member" 23 includes any member who is employed by a public acute care 24 hospital which serves as a trauma center, and which provides treatment to members of the public with deadly or crippling 25 26 infectious diseases, members of the public who are accused of 27 or convicted of serious violent crimes, members of the public 28 who have been subjected to hazardous materials or biological 29 or chemical agents as a result of terrorism or industrial accidents, or members of the public with diseases the 30 31

treatment of which requires interventions with extremely toxic substances.

Section 2. Paragraph (h) is added to subsection (2) of section 121.0515, Florida Statutes, to read:

121.0515 Special risk membership.--

- (2) CRITERIA.--A member, to be designated as a special risk member, must meet the following criteria:
- (h) A member who is employed by a public acute care hospital which serves as a trauma center, and which provides treatment to members of the public with deadly or crippling infectious diseases, members of the public who are accused of or convicted of serious violent crimes, members of the public who have been subjected to hazardous materials or biological or chemical agents as a result of terrorism or industrial accidents, or members of the public with diseases the treatment of which requires interventions with extremely toxic substances.

Section 3. The Legislature finds that in providing treatment to members of the public with deadly or crippling infectious diseases, members of the public who are accused of or convicted of serious violent crimes, members of the public who have been subjected to hazardous materials or biological or chemical agents as a result of terrorism or industrial accidents, or members of the public with diseases the treatment of which requires interventions with extremely toxic substances, a member of the Florida Retirement System who is employed by a public acute care hospital which serves as a trauma center, is serving an important state interest and should be a member of the special risk class of the Florida Retirement System.

Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 2002.

HOUSE SUMMARY Includes a member of the Florida Retirement System in the special risk class of the system if the member is employed by a public acute care hospital which serves as a trauma center and which provides treatment to members of the public with deadly or crippling infectious diseases, members of the public who are accused of or convicted of serious violent crimes, members of the public who have been subjected to hazardous materials biological or chemical agents as a result of terrorism or industrial accidents, or members of the public with diseases the treatment of which requires intervention with extremely toxic substances. with extremely toxic substances.
