Section 236.6851, Florida Statutes, is 16 created to read: 17 236.6851 School Service Accountability Act.--18 (1) This act may be cited as the "School Service 19 Accountability Act of 2002." 20 (2) It is the intent of the Legislature to promote 21 effective and cost-efficient noninstructional services. 2.2 Accordingly, the Legislature believes that this intent is best 23 served when school districts analyze the provision of such

services and the quality of the services provided. When this intent is best served by private-sector providers, school districts shall contract with such providers for these services. Any cost savings that result shall be redirected to educational services for students. It is the further intent of

facilities operations and maintenance to determine the optimal

balance between the costs associated with providing such

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the Legislature that this be an ongoing, periodic activity of all school districts.

(3) Each district school board and superintendent of schools shall conduct a written analysis of the cost of providing student transportation, food services, and facilities operations and maintenance as well as the level and quality of services associated with each such service. This analysis shall be the basis of comparison for a request for proposals or solicitation of bids to be issued by a district school board for the provision of student transportation, food services, and facilities operations and maintenance. The form and substance of the analysis and request for proposals or solicitation of bids shall be consistent with that provided to the Department of Education by the Florida School Boards Association and Florida TaxWatch. Each district school board shall conduct an analysis and request for proposals or solicitation of bids for one of the noninstructional services listed in this section in each of school years 2002-2003, 2003-2004, and 2004-2005. A school district that currently contracts with a private-sector provider for any listed service is not required to have an analysis of that service conducted or to rebid that service and is exempt from the provisions of this section for that service. After the 2004-2005 school year, any school district that has not contracted for the provision of a noninstructional service listed in this section shall periodically conduct an analysis of such service according to the requirements of this section. (4) School districts may form consortia for the purpose of conducting an analysis and request for proposals or

solicitation of bids unless otherwise prohibited by law for a

specific noninstructional service.

- (5) Within 30 days after conclusion of the bid process, the district school board, at a regularly scheduled board meeting, shall disclose and discuss the responses to the request for proposals or solicitation of bids, including a written comparison to the analysis required in subsection (3) and a written report of the results of the bid process.
- (6) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, any cost savings realized by a school district through the provision of contracted noninstructional services pursuant to this section shall be retained by the school district and shall be used for the improvement of educational services for students. Use of cost savings earned in the provision of food services shall be governed by federal regulations.
- (7) The Department of Education shall provide technical assistance to school districts for the purpose of implementing this section.
- (8) Annually, as of January 1, each district school board shall report the results of implementation of this section to the Commissioner of Education. The report shall include:
- (a) New private contracts for the listed noninstructional services.
- $\underline{\mbox{(b)}}$  The anticipated cost savings associated with each new contract.
- (c) The district school board authorized use of the anticipated savings.
- (d) Actual cost savings and use of savings of prior-year private contracts.
- (e) A description of each instance in which a request for proposals or solicitation of bids process did not result in a contract, including a comparison of the school district

cost obtained from the cost analysis to the cost proposed by each bidder, the school district's reasoning for not entering into a contact, and where the school district's action or inaction is documented in public records.

(9) Annually, by February 1, the Commissioner of
Education shall issue to the Governor, the Speaker of the
House of Representatives, and the President of the Senate a
report that consolidates information submitted by the school
districts to the commissioner pursuant to subsection (8).

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2002.

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 Creates the School Service Accountability Act of 2002 to promote effective and cost-efficient noninstructional services in the public schools. Requires an analysis of expenditure of funds and quality of service for school district student transportation, food services, and facilities operations and maintenance. Requires the analysis to be the basis of comparison for a request for proposals or solicitation of bids to contract for such services. Requires disclosure and reporting by district school boards. Requires a report to the Governor and the Legislature by the Commissioner of Education.
